Chris Andres, administrator of the Chandler Municipal Airport, gave an excellent and extensive presentation on the airport, its history, current happenings and a look into the future. He was introduced by Jim Patmos.

Chris worked in Phoenix before accepting a position in Chandler. He has a Master's degree in Planning from ASU.

He said many people are not aware Chandler has a city airport. They think of Stellar Airpark along Chandler Boulevard in west Chandler.

He calls the airport a tremendous asset for the city. There are more than 3,300 airports in the U.S. He broke them down by category. Chandler is one of 259 reliever airports by classification.

Chandler airport is ranked 16th for business general aviation, and is 47th for takeoffs and landings. It provides aviation training, as well as private/recreational and business services. Chandler Airpark is the second largest employer in Chandler, behind only Intel. The new freeway around south Phoenix will help.




Paul Harris Fellow

est. Many older folks still may have an interest, middle-aged people are burdened with college debt, and the younger generation are not interested in planes. They're too busy with their cell phones. He also talked about the possibility of planes being run on electricity similar to the trend in cars today.

The Chandler Airport has six on staff, including Chris. Yet they manage to keep things moving seven days a week.

The main problem with the airport is the two runways are 4,870 and 4,401 feet long, respectively. The FAA requires runways of at least 5,000 feet in length to handle commercial jets. It is a problem not easy to solve.

The airport currently is in the middle of an 18-24 month Master Plan improvement that Chris hopes will be completed in about a year. Top priorities are; 1) safety first; 2) growth; 3) economic impact; 4) FAA and ADOT relationships; and 5) airport development.

The Master Plan will help focus on the future. An Open House is scheduled February 26, 2020 if you would like more information. Or you can contact chandlerairport.com for more info.
