By-Laws Revision

Chandler Horizon Rotary Club members voted to approve a recent revision of the club's by-laws at last week's meeting.

Program

Tim Schauer mann presented a program entitled, "Are American Colleges Too Expensive?" He and our members agreed the answer is "Yes!"

Tim noted he has served on the board of Pacific University in Forest Grove, Oregon, for 20 years, six as board chair. He also has served on several other committees, including Audit and Finance.

He said the Arizona Constitution states that "college costs should be 'As nearly Free as possible.'" These words are still sparking confusion, angry debate and even lawsuits.

Using Oregon State University as an example, their president recently noted that student tuition now pays more than 65% of the cost of operations and the state only 22%, a 50% decline in state contributions and a nearly 45% increase in families' share, just in the last 15 years.

Tim told us the development of Land Grant colleges was an idea that was first introduced in the late 1840s, but not enacted into law until 1862. Their mission has changed down through the years.

Most colleges were started by religious groups. Most notable among those that weren't is Stanford. In many colleges in the early years you couldn't graduate unless you could speak and write Latin and Greek. But they did help the poor.

Sources of funding include taxes, tuition, endowments, donations and outside scholarships from organizations like Rotary. He noted that

Hole-in-One Contest

Well, we made it through the second weekend of the 27th annual Chandler Horizon Rotary Club Hole-in-One Contest. Not the way we planned, due to the rainout Saturday, but we were able to make it up Monday.

Quite a few shooters came out Monday and it was a decent day, although we were short of members and volunteers to work, but those who were there bonded together and we "got 'er done."

Friday and Sunday were good days, although we also were short of workers on a couple of shifts. If you haven't signed up to work this weekend, please get on SignupGenius.com and make your selection. The list of those who have signed up for this weekend is printed on page 2.

We have had six holes-in-one...two each of the first two days and this past Monday, but none the other three days. The steady wind on Friday probably was a factor.

Now we head into the final weekend with qualifying Friday and Saturday, and the big shoot-out day Sunday, starting with the newly added Helicopter Ball Drop that will kick things off at approximately 12:30 p.m.

That will be followed by the semifinals at 1 p.m. So far we have 123 shots in the circle that qualify for the semifinals. That will be followed by the Women's Shootout when 10 ladies will shoot for the \$20,000 payoff and a shot in the overall finals. We have had 27 women shooters in the first six days of qualifying. If no woman gets a hole-in-one in the Women's Shootout, closest to the pin will win \$500.

The overall finals will start at approximately 2:30 p.m. when 20+ shooters will try for an ace that would earn them \$100,000. If no one gets a hole-in-one in the finals, the closest to the pin

 endowments vary. Princeton is the most wealthy with \$20 billion in endowments. They spend a lot on research. Harvard started its endowment program in 1650.

He showed a chart that displayed how students' tuition is discounted, depending on the ability to pay. Tuition from rich students pays for those students that are financially hurting. Many of the poor get in because they are really smart.

When enrollment at Pacific was declining, they raised tuition and enrollment went up. Parents wanted quality and were willing to pay for it.

Another chart showed that the United States and Canada have the lowest tax rate when compared as a percentage of the Gross National Product. Each country has little or no national sales tax. Countries in Europe are just the opposite.

He said one way to fix the tuition problem would be to install a 20% national sale tax. That isn't likely to happen anytime soon, so students and parents will continue to face rising tuition costs.
