### Program

Our own attorney in residence, Kristel Patton, presented a program on common scams that are currently happening. Her PowerPoint presentation offered numerous scams in a variety of situations.

She talked about scams involving the elderly, many of which could be classified as elder abuse or exploitation. These could include such activities as illegal use of resources or deprivation of proper care and advice, sometimes even by family members.

Financial losses suffered by the elderly are estimated at \$2.9 billion per year. Many factors can enter in, including mental illness, drug and/or alcohol abuse, and hostility. This needs to stop before it happens. It can be achieved through better communication creating a better relationship.

Kristel discussed three case studies that threw up red flags, which are often a sign of abuse involvement and sometimes power of attorney abuse. One involves a social situation, which can include significant others. Warning signs include isolation and moving away from existing relationships; they can occur if the victim is overly trusting and easily manipulated.

Another red flag is physical and cognitive. This can occur when the victim has a worsening illness, is dependent on care and sometimes includes items missing from the home. Another red flag is behavioral, when the victim becomes fearful and distrusting.

Kristel discussed several types of frauds, including affinity and charity frauds that probably include a con artist; identity theft and credit card fraud; investment schemes and fraud; plus phone, internet, price gouging, home repair and health care scams.
