Effects of Coronavirus Pandemic Are Major Topics of Club Assembly

President Greg Thornton conducted a Club Assembly. He repeated some information from the previous week's meeting, particularly regarding the Hole-in-One Contest. He urged members to contact sponsors that have not made their donation. Most of the expenses have been paid. When the remainder of the sponsor money comes in, the combined boards will meet to determine which organizations will receive donations this year... and how much.

It is likely our annual Thank You Breakfast, scheduled for May 6, will be postponed. Once the coronavirus threat is over, Pres. Greg will meet with San Marcos to find a date that will work for both of us. If it can't be scheduled before the end of the Rotary year June 30, an alternative payment program will be pursued.

President Greg noted he will meet with presidents of other District 5495 clubs and DG David Simmer to keep abreast of what is going on in the district.

Brent Patmos reported the Rotary International Convention, scheduled June 6-10 in Honolulu, Hawaii, has been cancelled. He also said he feels whenever the coronavirus threat is over, restaurants and other service organizations most likely will not be as we remember them.

He didn't elaborate, but it appears that the longer this drags on, the longer it will take to get things back to anything approaching normal. It could take several months, if not years.

Other members reported on their involvement in the past week, trying to bring help to those in need.

Marty Herder said it has been exhausting. He talked about the efforts of him, his family and

others. He told us about going to many stores, even as early as 5-6 a.m. trying to find products needed by people.

He thanked his "great wingman," Terry Locke. The two of them came together a week ago and have been working together to ease the situation. Marty said everyone should be on the Nextdoor app, that helps trying to keep people informed about what is and isn't available.

For those who aren't familiar, Nextdoor is a social networking platform for local communities and neighborhoods. With the Nextdoor app, users can interact with their neighbors, discuss community news, and recommend local services and businesses that they like.

"You almost have to ask at what point does the law of diminishing returns kick in and how is it affecting people," Marty said. "What we know now is a lot more than we knew four weeks ago,"

Terry Locke told us the Chandler Unified School District surveyed parents Monday. He noted that not every home has four or five laptops available for parents to use for work and students to use for homework. Obviously some sharing is necessary.

Terry also noted the CUSD will soon have instructions for parents who don't have access to a computer.

David Loutzenheiser talked about the challenge faced, not only by Basha High School where he is the principal, but also by all schools. "We have had to change our instructional patterns," he said. He hoped an online program would roll out within

A concern is what to do about students and parents who don't have the necessary technology. He noted only about 30 percent of families are familiar with the Internet, while 70 percent are not. Basha is working on a program for the rest of the school year.

He told us that the school facilities are constantly being disinfected and that no one is allowed on campus at this time. "If we let one person in, then we have to disinfect even more," he said.

Partly because of that, the Basha Gives Back program has been cancelled for this year. That is a program where students who come in as freshmen begin working on a project of their choice that will give back to the community. It all comes together when they are seniors. CHRC contributed to this program last year.
