Of particular notice this week was that although the Rotary International Convention in Honolulu has been cancelled, the District Conference is still scheduled from June 26-27 at Hilton Squaw Peak in Phoenix. Although the San Marcos Golf Course is still considered an essential business and is open, our annual Thank You Breakfast has been postponed from its original date of May 6. The best dates for a re-schedule are June 3 or June 10. Once the coronavirus pandemic is over and things return more to normal, Pres. The stepfather in the family died, Cassandra and her son lost their jobs, she was at wit's end and reached out to Terry for some help.

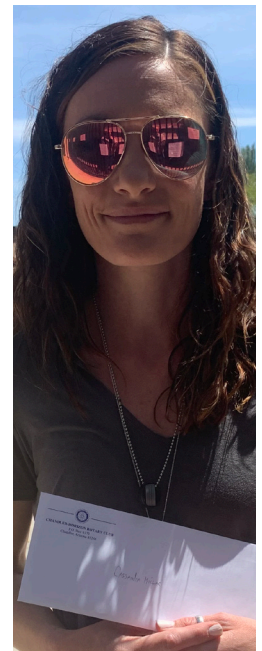
CHRC members stepped up and donated \$675 to Cassandra and her family.

CHRC Board Holds First Virtual Meeting

The regular monthly meeting of the Chandler Horizon Rotary Club board of directors was held Tuesday in a "virtual" set-up.

Treasurer Larry Gardner reported we have extra money in the account because we haven't had to pay for the weekly breakfasts at San Marcos. He noted dues statements have been sent out and our Foundation will receive a check in excess of \$800 for fines collected during the third quarter of this Rotary year.

On a related note, the board approved sending \$60 per week to San Marcos to help servers who have missed out on tips while we are not meeting there.

Foundation Treasurer Jim Hoenig presented an updated report of the Hole-in-One Contest. All expenses have been paid but we still are expecting additional income. If all those monies come in we will have in excess of \$32,000 net.

Marty Herder mentioned that if we subtract money spent on prizes, our expenses would be about 22 percent of income. The average range for a non-profit is 15-30 percent.

Jim will make the annual HIO financial report at our club meeting next week.

The club and foundation boards will hold a joint meeting April 21 to determine which organizations receive money...and how much. There was discussion about that.

May 13 was mentioned as a potential date to return to our regular meetings, although the board agreed that might be a bit premature. When we do return most likely food will be served but there will be no buffet.

A tentative date of June 3 (or June 10) for our annual Thank You Breakfast was discussed. Invitations

will need to go out three weeks before the event. If one of those dates can't be achieved the breakfast likely will be cancelled and monies will be donated to organizations in a different manner that is yet to be determined.

President Elect Marty Herder wants to delay discussion of the 5 Avenues of Service until we return to regular meetings.

President Greg reported dates of our Hole-in-One Contest are set for next year and will remain the same with a President's Day weekend start, although the contract has not been signed.
