tion in business, but after two weeks they are making significant progress in the “new normal.”

Wendy’s, like others, is considered a Quick Service Restaurant, all of whom are “figuring it out.” The restaurant service industry has the largest number of unemployed workers in the U.S., many of whom are living paycheck to paycheck.

Food Service is at the tip of the spear, especially concerning pork and beef. Brent reported Omaha Steaks has seen a 1,000 percent spike in orders.

Temperature checking of food and the health screening of food service employees are being conducted through the FDA.

Brent said many other businesses are being impacted, including such public arenas as museums. “The stimulus package will have a direct
