The Chandler Horizon club and foundation boards held a virtual joint meeting Tuesday. The purpose of the meeting was to determine which charitable organizations will receive donations from the Chandler Horizon Rotary Foundation following our 27th annual Hole-in-One Contest.

PP Theresa Clemmons provided information sheets showing the organizations that received donations last year, not only at our annual Thank You Breakfast but also throughout the year.

Those organizations plus others to which we have been committed were determined first. Then others were discussed.

Emphasis was placed on those that might be in greater need at the present time. The boards decided to leave a few thousand to serve any organizations that might pop up over the next few months.

A total of \$30,000 was designated. Part of that will be given away at our annual Thank You Breakfast on either June 3 or 10. If we are not able to host the breakfast because of the coronavirus pandemic, another method will be determined to get the monies to the recipients.

Club Assembly

President Greg Thornton will conduct another Club Assembly during our virtual meeting when once again we will discuss the effects of the coronavirus pandemic and issues involving the Chandler Horizon Rotary Club.

Hole-in-One Contest

Foundation Treasurer Jim Hoenig made his annual report to the club on our Hole-in-One Contest last week. Members had received a copy of the report via email on Tuesday and were able to review it along with Jim.

He noted the totals are not complete because we still are waiting for some sponsor money and Helicopter Ball Drop money to come in as well as a refund from the Hole-in-One insurance.

The results with several previous years were made available to provide a comparison. Bottom line results for this year are a little lower than 2019, but considerably ahead of 2018 which was a down year.

Results from 2007 and 2001 also were given. We had the highest sponsor income in 2007 (more than \$50,000) and the highest amount of money raised from shots in 2001, although we came within \$600 of reaching that total this year.

There were participation statements from both this year and last. We had more women shooters this year.

Member participation in working shifts was a bit lower than last year, although we had a big jump in support from outside organizations, particularly the Chandler Police Department Explorers, Basha Interact club and the YMCA. There were lists of all outside organizations that have helped, including the years and number of supporters.

We had 180 semifinal qualifiers this year, down from 204 in 2019 and about in the middle for the 27 years. The most was 235 in 2001, again the year we had the most money raised from shots.

We had nine holes-in-one, exactly half the total from 2019. The most was 20 in 2009 which beat 2008 by one. We have had 13 five times.
