Program

In our first attempt at having some form of program once again, Garrett Broolsma and Colleen Buck joined us from the Chandler-Gilbert Family YMCA. Garrett, a former member of CHRC and now a member of the Chandler noon club, is Executive Director of the Y.

Colleen is Director of the Y's I-Learn program. We first met up with her when our club met at the YMCA, in fact in her classroom.

She had a few technical problems, so Garrett started off. He noted the last 6-8 weeks have been "very different." When the Stay at Home order came down March 17, the Y shut down most of its programs. About a week later, the Y started up again, practicing social distancing, but offering three meals a day to those who needed them.

The YMCA currently is open from 6:30 a.m.-6:30p.m. for ages 2-13. Explaining how drastically the world has changed, Garrett noted how "hard it is to keep younger students at a distance." The Y has been able to provide students with laptops and the students have been able to come in for meals.

The Y is conducting a Senior Outreach Initiative. He also said they have pre-recorded exercise and recipe videos for those who want to join a program.

Colleen finally gave up on her camera and re-joined us by phone. She told us the I-Learn

Board Meeting

The Board of Directors held its monthly meeting Tuesday.

The board heard that all income is in and all expenses have been paid so we have a final bottom line figure for our 27th annual Hole-in-One Contest. Checks have gone out to those organizations that normally receive donations at our annual Thank You Breakfast which has been cancelled due to the coronavirus pandemic.

President Elect Marty Herder reported he will begin getting out information on the 5 Avenues of Service implementation sometime in June so we can hit the ground running July 1 when the new Rotary year begins.

President Greg said he felt our first attempt at a virtual program went well on April 29 when Garrett Broolsma and Colleen Buck joined us from the YMCA. PP Theresa Clemmons has set up a schedule of programs continuing through June.

The I-Learn program at the YMCA was discussed. If you pledged \$25 toward the incidentals project please get your check in ASAP.

Pres. Greg also reported we have an agreement with Michael Rus at San Marcos for the 28th annual Hole-in-One Contest. The contract will be signed by Marty Herder when the new Rotary year begins July 1. The event will start February 13, 2021.

Since repeated attempts to contact Project 44 – Teen Suicide went to no avail, the board voted not to donate any funds from the Hole-in-One Contest to that organization this year. Instead, the board voted to increase the donation to the Assistance League of the East Valley by \$300 for a total of \$1,000. The board also voted to use the other \$200 plus \$300 from additional funds to donate a total of \$500 to Caborca, Mexico to be used for protective gear for medical staff as well as other medical needs for that impoverished area.

The two motions have been sent to the Chandler Horizon Rotary Foundation board for approval.

program works with the Chandler Unified School District and the City of Chandler. I-Learn was able to get back up and running by the end of March.

They currently have 53 students throughout the day. Eleven students have graduated, including four during the coronavirus pandemic. They hope to have another 25-30 by the end of May. She told us I-Learn grads can pick up summer school courses from their home school, and the fall schedule will open back up in July.

Colleen was ecstatic when she found out the I-Learn program will be the recipient of \$1,000 from our Hole-in-One Contest. She and Garrett both told us how grateful they are for our support.

Several club members have also pledged money to be used for supplies in the program. If you are one of those and have not sent in your donation yet, please do so ASAP. Send it either to the CHRC P.O. Box, or to Foundation Treasurer Jim Hoenig at his home address.

Tim Gibson has also offered to

spray weeds that have grown up in the parking lot and behind the facility. Once that is done and the weeds have died, some hands-on help will be needed from club members to clear the weeds.

Garrett told us the Y has applied for a \$10,000 grant from the city that will enable students to take field trips, etc., once the pandemic has passed. He said the annual YMCA Prayer Breakfast is scheduled for September 23 and is still on.

He also told us his 2½ year-old “miracle baby” is active and happy to have her daddy home more.

The inaugural Chandler Rotary Club virtual social was held last Wednesday evening. Twelve members, most spouses and even more pets got together in the comfort of their own homes for “Cocktails on the Couch.” There was good conversation, a few jokes and a chance to relieve the boredom of being home alone.
