Folks who want to join their efforts go through three days of intensive training in California. Sharon told us that not all dogs and their leaders survive the training, indicating there is a lot of stress on both dog and leader.

But those who survive go on to help serve and help comfort those going through traumatic events. Sharon said she and Abby helped in the Sonoma fire in California last fall.

Foundation Funds

President Greg announced last week that since we haven't heard from Project Connect 4 – Teen Suicide despite the repeated efforts of two board members, the \$500 allocated to them from the Holein-One contest has been rescinded.

The club and foundation boards approved \$300 of that money to serve as an additional donation to the Assistance League of the East Valley, bringing their total award to \$1,000.

The club board approved a \$500 donation to the Caborca, Mexico, project that is in need of medical supplies due to coronavirus and the effect it has had on that impoverished area. The foundation board turned down the request, however. A more recent motion to donate \$200 to the Caborca project was approved by both boards.

That will mean the \$500 originally targeted for Project Connect 4 will be given to the Assistance League and Caborca with the idea being that if future needs appear, the plan for additional funds to Caborca will be re-visited.
