Dr. Tim Overmiller Clarifies How Coronavirus Is Affecting Meat Production

Dr. Tim Overmiller from Hastings, Nebraska, joined us on the phone to tell us about the meat situation during the coronavirus pandemic, particularly in the area of hog farming. The program was arranged by Doug Gardner. Dr. Tim is a nephew of Doug and Larry Gardner.

Like Doug and Larry, Dr. Tim grew up in Smith Center, Kansas. He attended Kansas State,

where he played football and earned his degree in veterinary medicine. He has four sons and operates the Hastings Veterinary Center, but also serves Iowa, North Dakota, Kansas and the St. Louis area, and has worked around the country. He indicated some of the farms he deals with are very large..

He told us he travels a lot. In fact, he joined us while traveling to Omaha to attend a conference. He works mostly with small animals, primarily pigs.



His group does weekly diagnostics. He said sows that are bred today will have babies in four months, and they will be pork chops on the table in another 5-6 months.

He said sometimes animals get too big and are not prime for the table. "We try to take care of them," he said, "but when they are too big, farmers often lose \$30-40 per head."

He also noted that because of reduced requests from restaurants and schools that are closed for COVID-19, stockpiles are reaching a gridlock and

farmers may have to start euthanizing, although most of those he deals with will not have to do that. "It's difficult to do," he said.

Dr. Tim said he hates paperwork and regulatory work, but it's something he has to do. His organization deals with the European Union as well as countries like Mexico and China. About 30 percent of the affected animals have been wiped out in China, which owns about 50 percent of the sows in the world. That may create a problem in the future.

"It's kind of the elephant in the room," he said. "We are supposed to feed the world, but we may have to destroy animals."

He said he found out that morning that workers in a packing plant in Minnesota were tested Tuesday (5/12) and of 2,700 employees, 1,200 tested positive for the coronavirus. Ninety percent of those had no idea they were infected.

He said companies that are involved in export are owned by outside interests. Japan imports a lot of meat from the U.S. He said the United States has a good, safe meat supply.

Dr. Tim said he has been checking many coronaviruses, some from previous years. *Please continue reading on page 2*
