Responsibilities of Membership

The Flagstaff Rotary Club membership carries with it certain responsibilities:

- Attend biweekly programs of the club. Opportunities to make up attendance include attending the regular meeting of another Rotary club, attending various other Rotary meetings and socials, or attending a club service project authorized by the club board of directors.
- Pay a onetime Initiation Fee of \$25. (Does not apply to transfers from other clubs.)
- Pay quarterly dues of \$150. Donations during regular meetings (e.g., “Happy Bucks”) are totally optional, but please bring cash or check to the meetings for this.
- Participate in local or international activities or projects of the club.
- Take on committee and/or leadership roles within the club.

Going from Red to Blue Badge

Upon induction, you will be issued a new-member Red Badge. You will want to exchange it for a permanent Blue Badge as soon as possible. To do this, you must complete four requirements:

- Greet everyone as they enter for at least two regular lunch meetings. Help hand out badges and introduce yourself—it will help you learn names and faces.
- Attend a Board meeting, which are held at 8:30 a.m. the third Thursday of each month.
- Join a committee, according to your interests and/or the club's needs.
- Attend a Member Orientation session. You and your sponsor will be invited to a session with the President or Membership Director.
- Participate in a Board-sanctioned service project.
