

- Addition of students in 2003


Current trip status

- October or November each year
- 2 travel days, 2 work days
- ~30-50 volunteers each year
- Trained audiology tech from
 Alamos in 2018 to provide
 quarterly maintenance services in
 Guaymas

Cost of medical services	\$60,900
Cost of HAs fit	\$137,500
Cost of earmolds	\$9760
Hearing aid batteries	\$11,050 (cost for pt. purchase)
Total of donated goods and services:	\$219,210

The gift of communication

Hearing loss in children can lead to...

- Delayed speech and language skills
- Learning problems in school
- Feeling bad about themself
- Having trouble making friends
- Be unhappy in school

Hearing loss in children result in...

- Difficulty learning abstract words
- Difficulty with words with multiple meanings
- Falling further behind as they get older without intervention
- Difficulty with grammar and complex tenses
- Falling multiple grade levels behind in school

Adults with untreated hearing loss may have...

- Higher rates of depression, anxiety, and other psychosocial disorders
- Decreased social, emotional, and communication function
- Increased risk of dementia
- Effects of dual sensory impairment (e.g. visual loss) also need to be considered)

Adults with untreated hearing loss may have...

- Isolation from family, friends, social gatherings
- Difficulty securing or remaining employed
- Challenges participating in their own healthcare discussions and conversations.

Report from Rodolfo

July 2023

- **24** Consultations (5 cancellations due to weather)
- 13 HAs fit
- **10** earmolds made and fit, additional HAs repaired/cleaned/adjusted
- 2 patients referred to ENT

July 2023

- **17** Consultations
- **5** HAs fit
- 10 earmolds made and fit
- 10 HAs cleaned/repaired/adjusted
- 3 patients referred to ENT

Feb 2024

- **21** Consultations (8 adult, 13 children)
- 6 HAs, 4 were replacement for ones lost or "eaten by dog"
- 11 earmolds made and fit
- 6 HAs cleaned/repaired/adjusted
- 6 patients referred to ENT

May 2024

Anticipating 22 patients

Projected Summary for July23-June24 Fiscal Year

- **84** Consultations
- **34** HAs (24 already fit, 10 projected)
- 48 earmolds (36 already made, 12 projected)
- 16 HAs repaired/ cleaned/ adjusted earmolds made and fit
- 6 HAs cleaned/repaired/adjusted (more anticipated in May)
- 9 patients referred to ENT (more anticipated in May)

What else does it take to keep us running?

Audiology is dependent on technology

Jim Armstrong from e3/MSR West has been instrumental in keeping our aging equipment running for many years.

In 2023 he secured extensive donations of new equipment, installed, and calibrated it. This will allow us greater efficiency for many years to come, testing more difficult to test patients, and fitting hearing aids more accurately.
