Ace of Clubs Raffle—Raffle tickets are sold for \$5 each prior to the meeting being called to order. 1/3 of the proceeds goes to club operations account, a third is given to the daily winner, and a third goes into an accumulating pot. The daily winner is allowed to shuffle the cards remaining in the deck before selecting a card. If they select the joker, they win an additional \$20. If they select the Ace of Clubs, they win the large accumulating pot.

Happy Bucks—Sgt at Arms—Members and guests are free to donate cash or make pledges to verbally celebrate happy (or sad) events in their lives. There is no minimum amount, and no pressure to participate. The funds will go into the club operating account unless the donor documents their desire for them to be used for a specific purpose. Should they make that choice, it is urged that the donation be \$10 or more. Forms are provided to document any specific uses of cash or non-cash pledges.

Announcements regarding upcoming events and activities

Recognition of reaching giving or other achievement goals or new member induction.

Auction—Occasionally members who have enjoyed destination travel will bring back one or a collection of items to be auctioned. The proceeds benefit the club operating account

Program—At most meetings our Program Committee has arranged for an informative speaker to make a presentation to our members. Most programs are about 20-minutes long. Occasionally, there is club training, or business to conduct. The goal is to end the meeting by 1:00 PM.



1—THE ROTARY FOUNDATION ANNUAL FUND

TRF is one of the world's most highly-respected public charities. Donations are tax-deductible. Funds donated to the foundation support projects throughout the world in the seven areas of focus. The funds donated each year are invested for two years. The third year, district designated funds are shared back to the local districts so they have a say in how their share is used. The easiest way to give is to establish a monthly donation through your MyRotary account to be taken automatically through a debit or credit card account. Our club's annual goal would be met if each member gave \$20/month. We know that some members will not be able to make that large of a commitment, and others may wish to donate much more!

2—THE ROTARY FOUNDATION POLIO PLUS





Rotary's commitment to eradicate polio is so well known and respected that the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation matches donations \$2 for \$1. To take advantage of this opportunity to multiply the effect of your giving, you are again encouraged to donate through your MyRotary account. To meet our club's giving goal, a monthly recurring donation of \$10/month per member would be suggested. We know some members might not be able to make that commitment, so we encourage them to at least make a single donation each year through their MyRotary account. Those who have a passion for this endeavor and the means to give more are certainly encouraged to do so.

3—THE ROTARY VOCATIONAL FUND OF ARIZONA (TRVFA)



TRVFA provides vocational education grants for adults in Arizona who are at or below 150% of the poverty level to obtain vocational certifications which will enable them to lift themselves out of poverty and contribute to the Arizona economy.

The Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona is a Qualifying Charitable Organization meaning donations to TRVFA qualify for Arizona Income Tax Credit. Single filers can offset their Arizona State Income Tax obligation up to \$495, and joint filers up to \$987. Go to www.trvfa.org and click on the red "donate now" button at the top of the home screen.

One of the giving options is to set up a regular recurring donation. Join several Mesa West Rotary members to have selected this convenient method of giving to help others help themselves.

4—MESA WEST ROTARY FOUNDATION (MWRF)



Mesa West Rotary Club has its own 501(c)(3) public charity enabling our members and those in our circle of influence to give tax-deductible donations to support the charitable work of our club.

MWRF is a separate legal entity and has its own board of Trustees managing its operation. The immediate Past President of the club automatically becomes the Vice President of the foundation the year following their year of service as Club President. The following year, they move up to preside as President of the foundation.

The club board recommends an annual budget for charitable giving, and the foundation board will review and either amend or approve the budget to ensure consistent integrity and viability of the fund.

Since 2018-19, the club has held an annual sponsorship drive to bring in funds to support our charitable endeavors. These drives have resulted in averages exceeding \$50,000 per year. There are several advantages to this approach:

- A. It eliminates "cost of fundraising" involved in hosting public events.
- B. It eliminates the time commitment of planning and carrying out public fundraising events.
- C. Members are encouraged to tell their Rotary stories to friends, family and associates, and encourage them to donate to support things the member is passionate about being involved with.
