## **OUR EFFORTS: 12TH GRADE STUDENTS**

• <u>Homeless</u> students are those who lack a fixed, regular, adequate nighttime residence

Motels, Hotels and trailer parks, campgrounds

Emergency or transitional shelters

Park benches, public spaces, abandon buildings, bus or train stations

<u>UNACCOMPANIED</u> – meaning no parents or legal guardian

## WHAT IS: MCKINNEY VENTO HOMELESS ACT OF 1987

- The McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act of 1987: As it relates to Public Schools
  - Ensures <u>homeless children transportation</u> to and from school free of charge, allowing children to attend their school of origin (last school enrolled or the school they attended when they first became homeless) regardless of what district the family resides in.
  - It further requires <u>schools to register homeless children</u> even if they lack normally required documents, such as immunization records or proof of residence.
  - Local school districts must appoint Local Education Liaisons to ensure that school staff are aware of these rights, to provide public notice to homeless families (at shelters and at school) and to <u>facilitate access</u> to school and transportation services.
  - Staying in their original school is important for mental health, stability in an unstable environment and <u>high school graduation</u>




Unemployment

## ROTARY BUILDS BRIDGES: MCKINNEY VENTO – LAST YEAR

#### To help our most vulnerable youth learn there is HOPE in the World

- 1. Stipend Earn pp to \$100 per month for Attendance & A, B, C paid out after graduation <u>Why?</u> To give a little financial aid to students that are homeless and unaccompanied when they graduate
- 2. <u>September:</u> Meet and Greet Mentors meet the students selected for the program. Introduction to the Program, review goals and expectations and why there were selected. Share a meal, give out a blanket. Collect Holiday Wishes. <u>Why?</u>
  Build trust
- 3. Helen's Hope Chest Our students can shop by appointment and pick out up to 5 outfits, 2 times during the program. Work with Nancy McMurray for appointment. **Why?** To give dignity to our homeless and unaccompanied 12<sup>th</sup> graders.
- 4. Compudot: Through Helen's Hope Chest they have approved a laptop to the students to keep. **Why?** To enable connection after high school.
- **5.** <u>December:</u> Holiday Wish Program: Fulfill our students Wishes for the Holidays. <u>Why?</u> Fulfilling an unexpected wish from Rotarians is both a gift to us and to demonstrate we care about them individually.
- 6. Follow Up: Transition to TRVFA, College Bound, The Mesa Promise, Career **Why?** To help bridge them to their next journey in life
- 7. <u>June:</u> Celebration Provide stipend cash for Graduation in June/July at a Club Meeting.

   anything I needed"














#### **Holiday Wish Program**
