  - We will be serving a meal to 150 people in Apache Junction in October



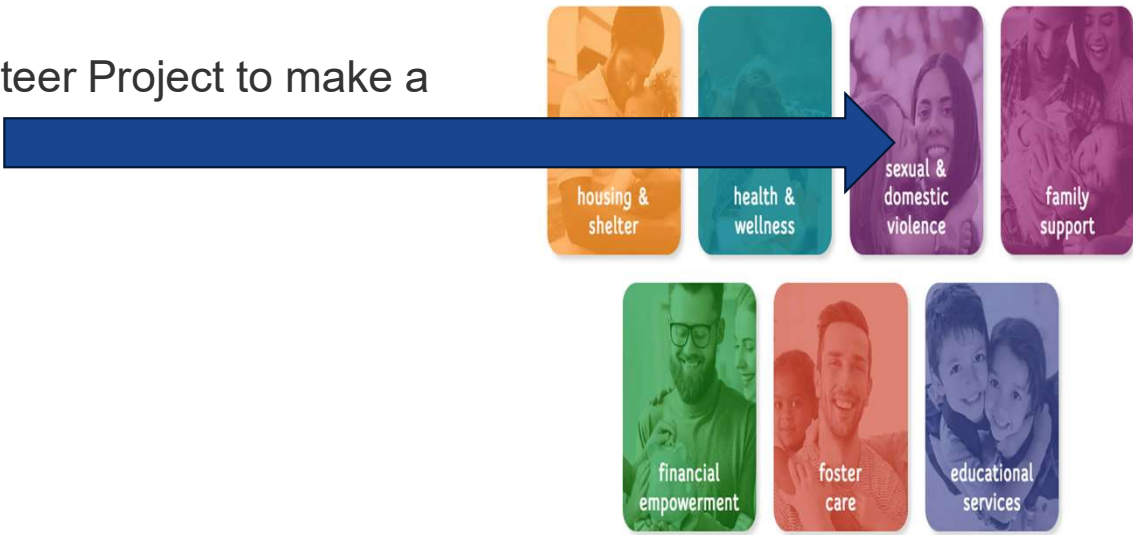
# PROGRAM 7/13 – FOSTER 360

- **1979** Immunization of 6 million children<sup>+</sup> in the Philippines
- ● **1985** 1,000 children/day contract polio
- **1988** worldwide cases in 125 countries
- **2023** 7 children with polio

# WHAT IMPACT CAN YOUR DONATION HAVE?

- 60 cents can protect a child from polio<sup>+</sup> ◦
- \$50 clean water to fight waterborne illness
- \$500 can launch an antibullying campaign to create a safe environment for children



- **Types of Individual Donations**
  - Annual Fund
  - Polio Plus
  - Endowment



- **How are Annual Fund-SHARE contributions used?**
  - 47.5% credited to World Fund
    - Global Grants
  - 47.5% credited to District Designated Fund
    - District Grants
  - 5% used for operating costs



- **Endowments – Principal Never Spent<sup>+</sup>**
  - Earnings are directed to TRF Grants and Programs
  - Types of gifts:
    - Current = cash
    - Planned gift in an estate
    - Combination

## Individual Recognition

- **Sustaining Member**
  - **Annual Fund contribution of \$100**
- **Paul Harris Fellow**
  - **\$1,000 to Annual Fund, Polio Plus or Grants**
- **Major Donor – individuals and couples**
  - **cash gifts of \$10,000**
- **Arch Klumph Society**
  - **\$250,000 - six levels**

# Foundation Recognition Points

- **Awarded to donors**
  - Annual Fund, Polio Plus, Disaster Relief or approved global grant
  - Donors receive one FRP for each dollar
- ● **Donors can transfer FRPs to others**
  - Become Paul Harris Fellow
  - Multiple PHF
  - Transfers must be in increments of 100 points
- **Do not count for Paul Harris Society or Major Donor**

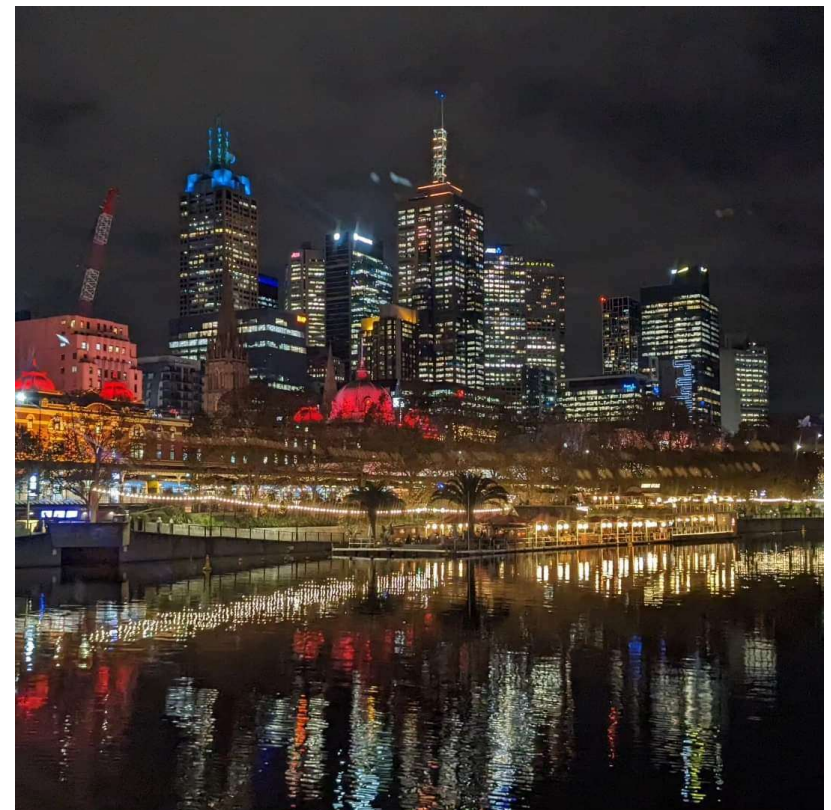

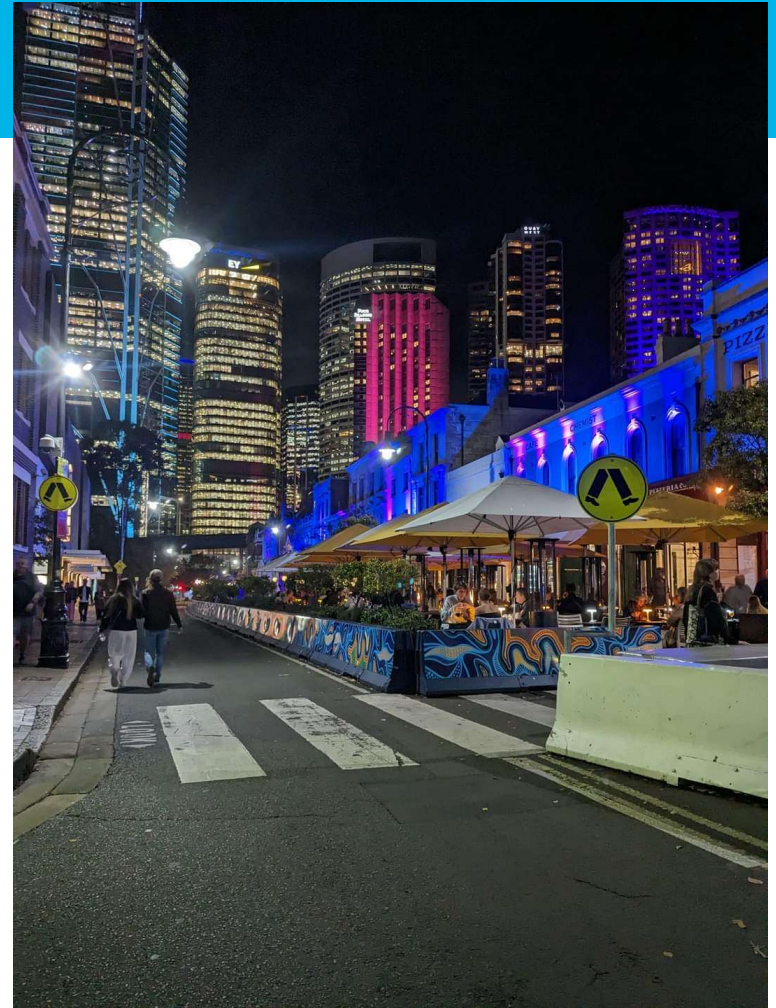

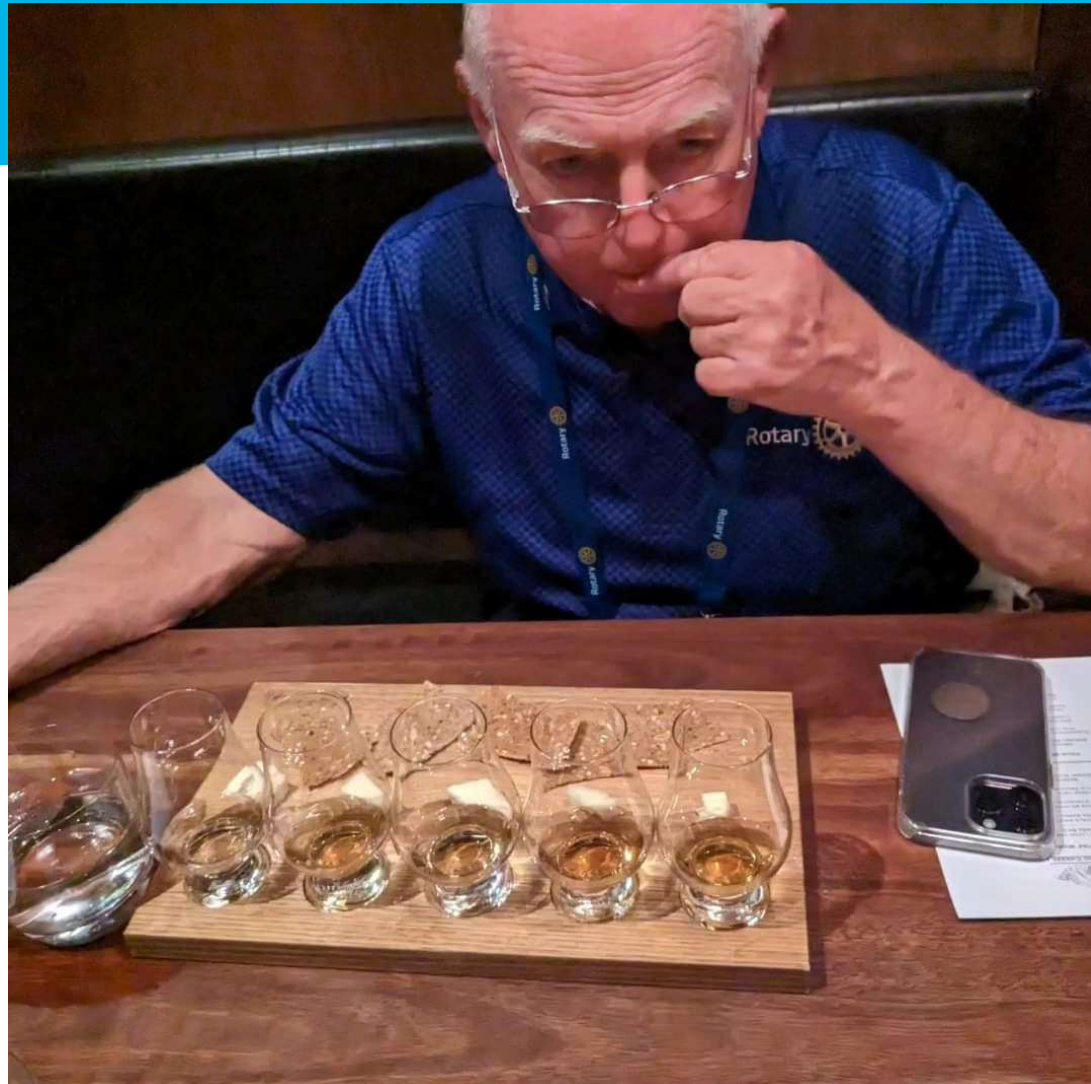
