Rotary youth exchange students spend the year living in an overseas city with a host family and attending school. The coordination and monitoring of this takes a couple of hours each week.

YOUTH SALUTE

Youth Salute is a recognition program for high school juniors who are leadership achievers. The program is designed to applaud young people who are good citizens, have at least a B grade point average, and have been elected to a leadership position by their peers, in their schools and or community organizations. Youth Salute accents what is right with young people. It puts promising youth leaders into the spotlight. Youth Salute nominees become role models for their peers and receive the encouragement they need to continue their efforts, supported by the Club's mentoring program.



YOUTH MENTORING

Youth Mentoring is designed to assist the high school student prepare for a job, career, or education. The program is designed to help students who are planning to immediately enter the job market, enter a trade or vocational school, or enroll in a college or university after high school. This takes a couple of hours each month.

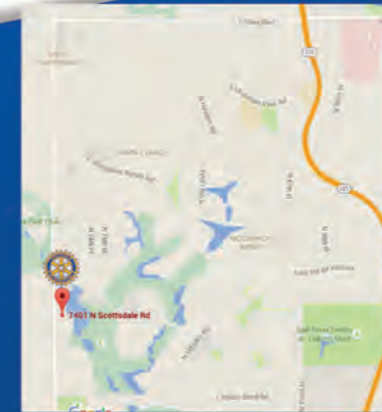

- Youth Service** recognizes the importance of empowering youth and young professionals through leadership development programs such as Rotaract, Interact, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards, and Rotary Youth Exchange.
- Vocational Service** calls on every Rotarian to work with integrity and contribute their expertise to the problems and needs of society.

CLUB SERVICE OPPORTUNITIES

- Meeting Greeter** - Half an hour, before meetings
- Registration Desk** - 45 minutes at start of meetings
- Invocation, Pledge of Allegiance** - A few minutes each meeting
- Announce Guests and Visiting Rotarians** - A few minutes each meeting

COMMUNITY SERVICE AND FUNDRAISING OPPORTUNITIES

- Salvation Army bell ringing at Nordstroms** - Two hour shifts during the holiday season
- Tennis With A Cause** - Mixed doubles event featuring tournament play preceded the night before by an auction and Pro-Am event. Bi-weekly meetings lead up to the springtime event, or just attend the event. Help set up the tourney, bring in sponsors, or just play!
- Ed Adler Golf Tourney** - A foursome scramble, followed by an evening Club meeting and silent auction. Help set up the tourney, bring in sponsors, or just play! Two hour meetings lead up to the day long event.

YOUTH SERVICES

SCHOLARSHIPS

The Scholarship Program is a district/city wide competition in seven separate categories, plus the Norval O. Tyler Scholarship (which is named after an outstanding Rotarian). RYLA

Rotary Youth Leadership Academy (RYLA)
This retreat is held at the Salvation Army's Camp Ponderosa, amongst the pines of the White Mountains, near Heber, AZ. Some 80 plus high school students and Rotarians will enjoy dynamic motivational speakers, as well as seminars on leadership, teamwork and conflict resolution. Mixing in plenty of sports and recreational activities makes this a wonderful, memorable experience.
