This honor was in recognition of COL Shaw's exemplary service to our country during his dis-

tinguished military career and for his continued service to our country as a vital member of many military and community service organizations.

In 2006, COL Shaw was inducted into the Arizona Veterans Hall of Fame - this award was presented by Governor Napolitano. Col Shaw was inducted into the Infantry Officer Candidate School Hall of Fame in 1991 (an honor bestowed upon only 1% of it's graduates). Colonel Shaw graduated from Kentucky Military Institute in 1942, the summer after Pearl Harbor, and immediately enlisted in the Army. At 19 years old, he was commissioned as a 2nd Lieutenant, infantry, at Ft. Benning, Georgia. He served extensively in the Southwest Pacific during World War II and participated in the initial assault wave on Luzon, Philippines, in 1945 and in the initial occupation of Hokkaido, Japan. Following the war, Colonel Shaw served as member of the General Staff at the 6th Army Headquarters at the Presidio in San Francisco.



Dr Honora Norton's community service started when she chartered and served as president of a General Federation Junior Woman's Club (GFWC). GFWC, founded in 1890, is an international women's organization dedicated to community improvement through volunteers. Dr. Norton moved up GFWC's state, national and

international leadership ladder to become its DC's headquarters Status of Women Chair. As a Paradise Valley GFWC member, each year she volunteers at Paradise Valley Mall's Holiday wrapping booth. Dr. Norton served as Starlight Children's Foundation Board Chair (2009-2012); and, currently serves on: Catholic Charities Community Services Executive Board as Chair-elect and serves on CCCS's Veteran Services Task Force, Audit and Development & Advancement Committees; Arizona Interfaith Movement Council; Rotary Club of Scottsdale Board as Treasurer/PR Chair; and, serves as Advisor to The Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona and GenerationE Non-profit Boards. Dr. Norton has served as Airpark Rotary Club President; Rotary International District 5510 Assistant Governor and Peace Fellows Chair; Caring Place founder and board member; Scottsdale's Boomerz founding team member.

Throughout her life, Dr. Norton has led and/or participated in in hundreds of community and faith-based projects related to: arts; environment; beautification programs; welfare/dignity of women and families; education - scholarship, library, literacy and learning disability programs; women and children health issues; community improvement - senior and teen centers, food pantries, block protection programs, parks, historical and art museums, playgrounds and women's shelters; legislation advocacy - public policy and social justice; safety - traffic (served on county and state level committees), children and vulnerable adults; international affairs - United Nations (GFWC), Project Concern (GFWC), Rotary's PolioPlus (immunization team member in Mexico's barrios) and water, orphanage and school Rotary International grant projects; women's history (GFWC) and armed forces support. She has led senior and youth center feasibility studies and formation projects. Dr. Norton was the 2013 Recipient of Starlight Humanitarian Award.

Dr. Norton states her personal strength is "connecting the unexpected." Joining this strength with her former corporate (Fortune 500 business consulting); IT computer data center, software development and call center management; small business-ownership; championing stewardship principles; and, faithbased, for-profit and non-profit working and volunteer experiences - Dr. Norton, now retired to rejuvenated action, has and continues to sustain and grow non-profit organizations in the Greater Phoenix area. Her publication "Stewardship is Spirituality" is available through iTunes, Barnes and Noble.



## 2016 Service Award Dinner Keynote Speaker NFL Hall of Famer Nick Lowery

Nick Lowery set all-time NFL records for accuracy, most field goals and most games with two 50-yard field goals. He was chosen to seven ALL-NFL teams and kicked the game-winning points in three Pro Bowls.

Nick has a "Kick with Nick" program for United Cerebral Palsy, the longest-running player fundraising program in NFL history. In 1993, he won the NFL Players Association's most prestigious award, the Byron R. "Whizzer" White Humanitarian Award. His "Adult Role Models for Youth" program has evolved into "Youth Friends" through the YMCA, connecting over 13,000 young people with 3,000 volunteers in the Greater Kansas City area.

Nick co-founded Native Vision in 1995, a program using professional athletes as high-impact mentors for Native American Youth. The program was recognized in 1997 on "Oprah" as the foremost program for Native youth.
