Scholarship Winners:

Each year the Rotary Club of Scottsdale solicits nominees from counselors at the high schools for its Scholarship Program. The nominees are interviewed by Rotarians and winners are selected in several categories.

Youth Salute Winners:

This unique Rotary youth program recognizes high school juniors who are determined by their school counselors to have great leadership potential. This year some 82 high school juniors were nominated. Winners are selected based upon interviews and their impromptu presentation. Each receive a scholarship for a trip to St. Louis, Mo., to participate in the Town Meeting on Tomorrow, a leadership conference sponsored by Washington University and the National Council on Youth Leadership. Rotary Youth Leadership Academy
