Rotary International Was Founded In 1905

In the early 1900s, a young Chicago lawyer named Paul Harris met frequently with friends, colleagues, and other professionals in after-hours discussions of the issues and concerns of the times.

Harris recognized the benefits of formalizing the meetings so that the group could share in each member's knowledge and solutions.

The first meeting of The Rotary Club of Chicago was held on February 23, 1905. Harris gave the organization its name because the meetings were rotated at the members' places of business.

Rotary is service-driven and offers an organized outlet for contributing to the community. Rotary's global network of 1.2 million members in more than 30,000 Clubs in 200 countries concerns itself with truth, fairness, improved relations between people, and world peace.
