

One day a student walked into the vice principal's office of her middle school in Paramus and said that she wanted to start a new extracurricular group, a React Club, now known as an Interact Club. The vice principal asked her to explain to him what a React Club was all about. This was MY introduction to Rotary in 2003. Because of that student and the assistance of the local Rotary club, the Interact Club quickly flourished and is still a vibrant club at the school today. After leaving Paramus and moving on to become a principal in Rockaway Borough, I again had the opportunity to connect with and become active in various projects and activities of the local Rotary club through my superintendent and my wife who had become a member and president of the club. I was always motivated towards service to others so after retiring, following a 33 year career as a teacher and administrator



in various public school districts in northern New Jersey and a stint as principal of St. Mary's School in Wharton, I joined the Rockaway Rotary Club in 2009, eventually becoming president in 2012-13. Disaster Relief Through District Donor Advised Fund

Thanks to the generosity of Rotarians in District 7470 five Rotary Clubs in the district have been able to link with community organizations to provide relief from the impact of Superstorn Sandy back in fall of 2012. The Rotary Foundation has approved grants for disaster relief from the District's Donor Advised Fund that was created post Sandy. The Rotary Clubs of Denville, Lake Hopatcong, Madison, South Orange and Wallkill Valley were the catalysts for these grants.

After Sandy the district Rotarians responded generously in donating to the Donor Advised Fund that was set up by the late Avi Tilak to respond to emergency needs. About half of the donations were distributed immediately in southern New Jersey, the most hard-hit portion of our state. The balance of approximately \$24,000 has helped to provide grants to the Denville Fire Department, Family Promise of Morris County, the Madison YMCA, the Visitation Relief Center in Brick, N.J., and the Skylands Outreach Depot, an affiliate of Mission Central HUB.
