
Vocational Assembly Nominations

Our district enjoyed a typically active year in The Rotary Foundation funded projects during the 2014-15

cycle with district grants, global grants, a GSE exchange and several clubs working on future global grants in various stages of preparation.

First and foremost, 15 clubs shared over \$18,000 in District grants that ranged from combating water borne diseases in Haiti to improving the health, education and public well-being locally. These grants ran from \$1,500 with a \$500 club match to an outright grant of \$1,000 that was not matched.
