Newton Rotarian, Sheriff Mike Strada, (assisted by Hillary), presented an interesting and informative overview of the Sussex County jail (AKA the Keogh-Dwyer Correctional Facility). Mike shared a historical perspective of the facility as well as an abundance of factual information on how the population is managed.

The building was constructed in 1978 to hold 88 inmates. In 2013 there was an average population of 160 inmates with total bookings of 1446. The facility houses inmates with a sentence of a year or less or those awaiting trial. Cells are 8' x 12' and have two or three inmates.

Mike described the Home Detention Program, the SLAP/SWAP Programs and shared a statistical profile regarding those incarcerated. Mike's topic and presentation elicited numerous questions from the audience.
