PROGRAM: 'CARE ONE' and a NARCAN TRAINING SESSION:

Sheriff James Gannon began the program, Chelsea, Assistant Coordinator of Hope One, standing in for Erica Valvano, Morris County Sheriff's Office, Coordinator of Hope One; Al Shurdom, Case Manager, Hope One; Caroline "Cary" Bailey, Certified Peer Recovery Specialist, CARES - Center for Addiction, Recovery, Education & Success

Sheriff Gannon began by noting that when he began his campaign for his office, he was Tok that he would have to knock on at least 4,000 doors. So he knocked on 9,000 doors! What he found was that citizens were most concerned with the opioid addiction problem. Once elected, he was determined to focus on the at risk population, and he developed the Hope One outreach program. lives around though programs in mental health. In fact, mental health problems are now edging out addiction in suicides now. Statewide, suicides and homicides are up. There are about 350 homeless in Morris county, mainly camping out in the Morristown and Dover areas and they provide outreach services to them. A tri-fold packed with listings of several hundred agencies and programs was distributed. Al and Caroline - "Cary" (above) spoke about how they were able to turntheir lives around and are now helping others. Cary then instructed us in the use of NARCAN and distributed kits to each of us. A great program, thanks to Sheriff Gannon and his crew!
