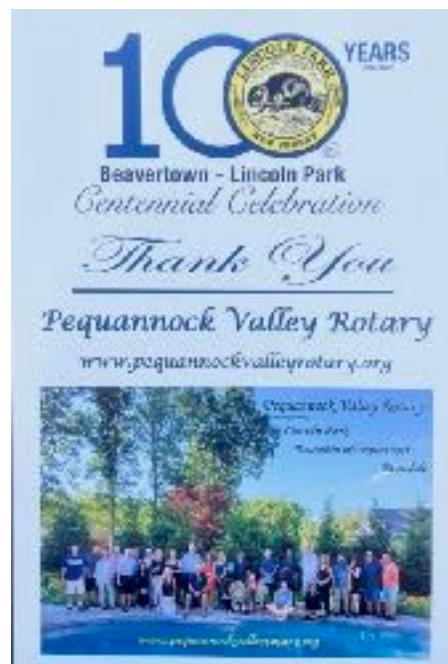
HAPPY/SAD DOLLARS:
