PROGRAM: PEQUANNOCK TOWNSHIP'S FIRST

RESPONDERS: Melissa's first speaker was Tom Lyons, Chief of the First Aid Squad who joined our first aid squad in 2007, had 30+ years with the Clifton Fire Department, was an EMT, dispatcher, and deputy chief. He began as an EMT in Nutley in 1978. He became Chief here in 2015 was a lieutenant and captain beforehand. He related story of woman having a heart attack in Stop & Shop, and how a special set of circumstances led to her life being saved by a trained customer and the quick arrival of the Police and EMT's who began CPR, defibrillation and worked for one hour and fifteen minutes and got her back.

Tom noted the cohesive response of the first aid squad PD and FAS: people who care. He spoke about the crazy times during Covid; two stage masks, goggles and gloves are still the protocol today. They gained 13 new members during Covid's two years, had 37,000 volunteer hours served. They have 40 active members including cadets, EMTs, drivers and first aid responders. There are three ambulances and one special rescue vehicle. They filled

the oxygen tanks for the squad, police department and fire department.

Officer William Juliano of the PTPD Traffic/

Community Services Bureau echoed the great working relationship between the organizations and also reported they use body cams for all interactions. He thanked us all for the vests we provide for them. In 2023 he will retire after 24 years. He spoke of the reorientation of traffic bureau into as a community services bureau.
