1 Pequannock Valley Rotary Foundation General Fund...

- a. The general fund is used to support a multitude of service projects encountered throughout the year. Such as:
 - i. We provide both monetary and product support to the three community food pantries
 - ii. Provide support to local youth & school organizations some being; the Boy's and Girl's club of Pequannock, local Boys & Girls Scouts, local boys and girls sports teams, local High School leadership organizations.
 - iii. Support to the local Community Partners for Hope, a collaboration of local service and religious organization dedicated to building a stronger community through awareness, advocacy and action, (1) their programs of drug education and prevention assistance, and (2) their Grains of Hope food packing event. In seven years they have packaged over a million meals to feed people in Haiti & New Jersey.
 - iv. Support for needs of local emergency situations; i.e. Flooding, Hurricane Sandy, etc... The club maintains a relief fund for potential future emergences.

2 Peguannock Valley Rotary Foundation Save- A-Life Fund

a. PVR has had in existence for 20 years, a Save-A-life Fund. The "Save-A-Life" fund is earmarked to support local emergency organizations. Over the years, we've given close to \$70,000 in support of items like: ballistick vestic for Police officers, EMS Search and rescue seminar; mobile life saving equipment, etc.... Your contribution would help continue that great tradition.

3. . Pequannock Valley Rotary Foundation Scholarship Fund

a. We handed out our first scholarship in 1966. Since then, through 2017, we've handed out 320 scholarships totaling close to \$300,000 to students in Pequannock Township, Lincoln Park, & Riverdale New Jersey. A trust has been established to ensure future growth of local scholarship funds. The Foundation is committed to this growth and contributions to the Pequannock Valley Rotary Foundation can be earmarked exclusively to the scholarship fund.

- a. Gift of Life, Inc. of New Jersey is a project of the Rotary Clubs in District 7475. Their mission is to provide resources to children with congenital heart defects from anywhere in the world where our assistance is needed

5. Rotary International Foundation

a. The Rotary Foundation transforms your gifts into service projects that change lives both close to home and around the world. During the past 100 years, the Rotary International Foundation has spent \$3 billion on life-changing, sustainable projects. Ninety two cents of every dollar donated to The Rotary International Foundation is used for life-changing sustainable projects.

6. Rotary International Polio Plus

- a. In 1985, Rotary launched its Polio Plus program, the first initiative to tackle global polio eradication through the mass vaccination of children. Rotary has contributed more than \$1.7 billion and countless volunteer hours to immunize more than 2.5 billion children in 122 countries. In addition, Rotary's advocacy efforts have played a role in decisions by donor governments to contribute more than \$7.2 billion to the effort.
- b. Today, there are only three countries that have never stopped transmission of the wild poliovirus: Afghanistan, Nigeria and Pakistan. Just 37 polio cases were confirmed worldwide in 2016, which is a reduction of more than 99.9 percent since the 1980s, when the world saw about 1,000 cases per day.
