## **PROGRAM: UPDATE ON THE MAASAI GIRLS: PAUL MANTEL**

Avery Hart introduced her husband and guest speaker Paul Mantel by recalling the day they met in 1977 as extras on a movie set in Manhattan when the citywide blackout hit. Paul briefly gave the backstory of a vacation trip they took to Africa which led to meeting to the Maasai in Kenya. They found enlightened leaders who wanted to end FGM - Female Genital Mutilation and the sale of child brides - and slavery by encouraging girls a choice of getting an outside education and thus, increasing their value to the family and village. The program was begun in 2016 and was featured in The Rotarian magazine. The practice has now ended and young girls are sent to school. Other challenges have presented themselves such as water, a government mandate to move the whole village, finding and buying suitable cropland and protecting livestock. This past year, the Madison Interact club, pictured at right, recently raised \$2,700 for the charitable Maasai Girls Fund. Link.
