This week long leadership summer camp yearly provides over one hundred outstanding high school students opportunities to expand their leadership skills through cabin activities, athletic events, educational work shops, and team building.

ur club had the largest number of applicants to date for the RYLA awards. Our strong relationship with Hillcrest H.S. continues to pay dividends as two male and two female students were chosen to attend the Rotary Youth Leadership Award camp this June 5-10.

The winners are Judy Banos, Alma Medina-Gonzalez, Adrian Smoot and Andrew Flores. Two alternates also were selected.

RYLA was founded in the 1960's in Australia. The first camp in District 5810 was held in 1991. Each year about 175 students (rising seniors) go to Camp Hoblitzelle in Midlothian for a week that provides "outstanding student leaders an opportunity to expand and hone their leadership skills". The scholarships are valued at \$580 per camper.



Robert E. Casey, Jr. F.B.I. - North Texas Region

Mr. Casey will be introduced by **Dennis Dorsey**

Dennis Dorsey is the President and Chief Operating Officer of NorthPark Security, Inc.

He is also on the Board of the North Texas Crime Commission

NorthPark covers 2.4 million square feet and welcomes over 25 million visitors per year. It is projected to be one of the top five shopping destinations in the country with annual sales over \$1 billion. It is home to many luxury retailers, and hosts a variety of special events throughout the year.

n May 2006 Mr. Casey was appointed by the FBI Director as Special Agent in Charge of the Dallas Field Office.

A native of Indianapolis, Mr. Casey earned a B.S. degree from Indiana State University in 1980. He began his career as a police officer in the Houston Police Department in 1981, serving as a patrol officer from 1981 to 1984. He was recognized as "The Police Officer of the Year" for 1983 by the One Hundred Club of Houston. From 1984 to 1986 he served in the Houston PD's Criminal Intelligence Division as an investigator on the organized crime squad.

Mr. Casey was appointed an FBI special agent in 1986 and was assigned to organized crime and drug investigations in the Phoenix Field Office. In 1992, he was promoted to Supervisory Special Agent in the Criminal Investigative Division at FBI Headquarters in Washington, D.C., where he held program management responsibilities. In 1995 he was designated a field supervisor in the Chicago Field Office, where he supervised investigations in the violent crime and drug programs. In 2000, he

was promoted to Asst Special Agent in Charge of the Miami Field Office, where he had program management responsibility for the organized crime and drug programs.

Program Chair of the Day: Phillip Bankhead

In 2002, Mr. Casey was promoted to the ranks of the Senior Executive Service and assigned to direct a multi-agency task force in the Counterterrorism Division at FBI Headquarters. In 2003, he was appointed as the first Section Chief of the FBI's Intelligence Operations Section, where he was responsible for developing new intelligence processes and capabilities. In 2004, he was promoted to Deputy Asst Director in the Directorate of Intelligence, in which capacity he was responsible for development and oversight of the FBI's intelligence capabilities, policies, and processes. He has also represented the FBI on a number of national intelligence community and law enforcement boards and advisory groups.

Mr. Casey was awarded the honor of Distinguished Alumni by Indiana State University and is the recipient of a 2006 Presidential Rank Award for Meritorious Executive.







Dennis Dorsey, head of NorthPark Security introduced our speaker today, Robert



Casey, the FBI Special Agent in charge of the Dallas Field Office, describing

him as a true American hero. Mr. Casey stated that the FBI is one of

the most unique organizations in the world. It was founded to deal with interstate crime and threats from abroad, by investigating and enforcing criminal violations of the law and by collecting intelligence within the USA. He indicated that the FBI had national priorities for its work, with the first being to prevent terrorism, either by organized groups such as Al Qaida or by a lone wolf. Their second priority is counter intelligence. Their third is cyber national defense, protecting data and interfering with recruitment for support of terrorism over the internet. They also investigate public corruption, organized crime such as that by the Mob, and they enforce civil rights laws. Although violent crime used to be one of their top priorities, they no longer have the manpower to investigate any but the most high profile cases.



Dr. Dilday is the author of six books, Bible study literature, and numerous articles, including

- Personal Computer: A New Tool for Ministers, 1985
- Communicator's Commentary: I & II Kings, 1987
- Columns: Glimpses of a Seminary under Assault, 2004
- Higher Ground: A Call for Christian Civility, 2007

native of Amarillo, Texas, Russell Dilday grew up in Port Arthur, and Wichita Falls. He holds the B.A. degree from Baylor University, the M.Div. and Ph.D. degrees from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary. He has served as Vice President and President of the Baptist General Convention of Texas, Vice President of the Southern Baptist Convention, and President of the SBC Home Mission Board.

Following sixteen years as President of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, Dr. Dilday accepted in 1994 a joint appointment to the faculty of George W. Truett Seminary and to the administrative staff of Baylor University. At the Seminary, he taught courses in Preaching and Biblical Interpretation and served as Interim Dean of the Seminary 1995 to 1996. Baylor named him "Outstanding Professor" for the year 1999-2000. He retired from his work at Baylor at the end of the academic year, 2000. He presently holds the position of Chancellor of the B.H. Carroll Theological Institute headquartered in Arlington, TX.

In addition to interim pastorates at Park Cities Baptist Church in Dallas, First Baptist Church in Arlington, First Baptist Church in Plano, First Baptist Church in Richardson, and First Baptist Church in Richmond, VA, he served a 10-month term as Interim President of Howard Payne U. in Brownwood.

He has Honorary Doctorates from Baylor University, Mercer University, William Jewell College, and Dallas Baptist University. Both Baylor and Southwestern have named him a Distinguished Alumnus, Texas Baptists designated him Elder Statesman, *The Baptist Standard* listed him as one of the "ten most influential Texas Baptists in the twentieth century," *Baptists Today* recognized him with the Judson-Rice award for distinguished service, the Mainstream Baptist National Convocation inducted him into their Hall of Fame, and *Texas Monthly* included him in their "Texas Twenty," a list of influential Texans. He received Baylor University's George W. Truett Distinguished Church Service Award in 2004.

Dr. Dilday is married to the former Betty Doyen, a graduate of Baylor U. and the B. H. Carroll Theological Institute. She has been a public school teacher and is also a popular speaker and writer.


