Thomas R. Washington is a 11-generation direct descendant of John Washington, "the Immigrant", who was the first Washington to travel to the New World arriving 1657 on the Potomac River in the "Seahorse of London". George Washington, the Father of Our Country, is Tom's 8th great granduncle. Tom is married to Vivian Washington since 1982 and they have 2 children and 4 grandchildren. Tom and Vivian arrived in Texas in 1982 from Wisconsin.

Tom is a retired Certified Public Accountant and current Texas Real Estate Broker specializing in Commercial Real Estate. PE **Mark Kashar** introduced **Bud Naifeh** and Josephine Bryan, facilitator of the grant to the Philippines 3D Printer Project.



The grant will help provide 3D printers and related machinery for Makerspace labs in six Dumaguete City public senior high schools which will support a new Empowerment Technology course at these schools. The initiative is being spearheaded by the Department of Science and Technology in collaboration with the Department of Education – Dumaguete, as well as the University of the Philippines. The University of the Philippines trained 25 teachers in the practical application of 3D printers and how to integrate the course into the schools' curriculum. The project hopes to equip lower income Filipino high school students with a leading-edge technical skill which will allow them the opportunity to get high paying jobs.

Our speaker today was Kevin Randles, Executive Director of Camp John Marc.

The mission of Camp John Marc is to "inspire confidence for life through high-quality camping programs for children, teens, and families. Year round programming and specialized camp facilities are uniquely designed in partnership with Dallas-Fort Worth area pediatric hospitals, community volunteers, and health organizations who are dedicated to serving campers living with chronic medical and physical challenges. The dignity of each camper is nurtured at Camp John Marc as well as in the community through its outreach programs.

Camp John Marc is committed to making the camp experience a safe experience. All staff and volunteers are carefully screened, selected and trained. The camp medical team is the same medical team that cares for the camper year-round at their home hospital or doctor's office. Risk management principles are strictly followed, and emergency procedures are regularly reviewed and practiced.

They also believe every camper should feel safe while they are at camp. At the beginning of each week-long camp, they have an age-appropriate safety conversation in which they share our policies and procedures and empower campers to speak up if something feels unsafe or not right.

Risk Management plays an important role in maintaining a safe camp environment. Every Camp John Marc staff member commits to following a set of Risk Management Principles that include responsibilities such as knowing exactly who is coming to an activity and inspecting all equipment before each use. Reviewing each camper's medical notes is also an important part of CJM Risk Management.

Life-saving training in Rajshahi

I've always believed that the best Rotary projects are the ones that meet a community's most urgent needs head-on. The Rotary Club of Rajshahi Central, in collaboration with the Rajshahi Mohila Technical Training Centre (TTC), hosted a vocational training workshop to train 50 women on snake identification, rescue, and bite treatment.

Lately, our region has faced a new threat. Floods have been carrying a particularly dangerous snake, the Russell's Viper, from the Farakka Dam region into local communities. The risk of encounters has skyrocketed, and fear and misinformation can be as dangerous as the snakes themselves.

Members of the Rotary club decided to empower people with knowledge. The energy at the Mohila TTC campus was incredible. You could see the determination on the trainees' faces.

needs' faces. They were there to learn skills that could literally save a life — perhaps their own or a neighbor's.

Md. Abu Saeed, a snake specialist from Dhaka, gave practical, easy-to-understand advice. He taught them how to:

- Identify common snakes, distinguishing between venomous and non-venomous types.
- Safely rescue a snake without harming it or themselves.
- Apply crucial first-aid steps for a snake bite before professional medical help can be reached.

This project is a perfect example of Rotary's core mission. It was a collaborative effort that addressed a public health crisis.
