He is also a well-known voice talent on top Texas, Kansas and Indiana radio stations and manages his own production company Blazin' Blake Productions. Blazin' Blake Productions has produced nation-wide radio and

TV commercials in addition to creating specialized branding for companies.

Included in his many talents Blake is a published author of two books, Out of Sight Living: A Sightless Person with Pure Vision, and Blind for a Purpose, (Turning Life Challenges into Purpose in Life.

Totally blind since infancy from Retinoblastoma, an eye cancer that begins in the retina, Blake Lindsay offers a unique perspective on all aspects of Envision's employment, workforce development, education, and outreach programs for people who are blind or visually impaired.

speaker today Erin Chupka, VP of Program Services at Girls, Inc. She began her program by saying that she had researched Rotary and was very impressed with the club and the quality of the speakers. She said she is a Filipino-American and that her grandfather was from the Philippines. She said that many girls think that they can't do something because they have never seen someone like them accomplish it. So at Girls, Inc. they expose girls to experiences and how to navigate the barriers. They work with girls aged six to eigh-teen from low-income households. They have after-school and Summer programs in two locations, one near Love Field and one in South Dallas. They also bring programs to schools all over the Metroplex. Their program focuses on three elements: the first is Strong, which emphasizes healthy living. The second is Smart, which emphasizes education and especially STEM programs. The Third is Bold, which builds life skills and leadership. They have served over 2,100 girls; of those 55% were Hispanic and about %30 were Black. Of the girls they serve, 52% were aged six to twelve and 48% were aged thirteen to eighteen. Also 32% are from single-parent households and 75% are from low-income households. They try to introduce girls to women from diverse backgrounds. Their program has nearly doubled in the past two years. They launched a diversity program after George Floyd, and have won an award from The Dallas Business Journal for diversity. They have launched an online homework help center and are recruiting tutors. They have two models, one is open enrollment and the other is in individual schools. The tutors teach content, but also study skills. When the girls reach teenage, the program also focuses on selfesteem, and buids a sisterhood of support to help them navigate relationships. As far as vocational preparation, they help whether the girls want to go to college, go to trade school or go into the military.


