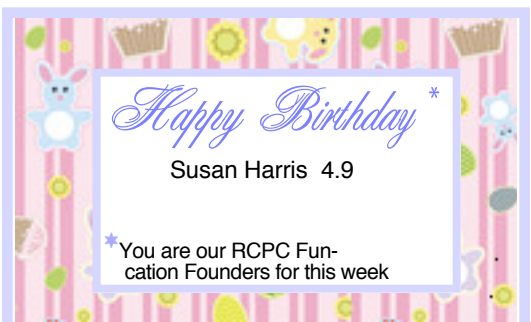
meetings, socials, PCR Connect events, etc. as soon as it is safe to do so.

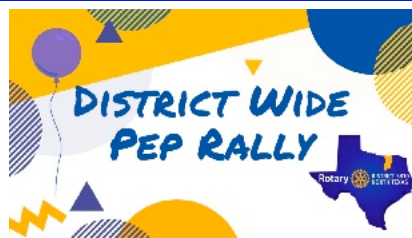

### LAST WEEK ["Best Of" Virtual Meeting] continued

stating that he had a foundation to educate people, especially children, about the Holocaust. Mr. Glauben began by saying that he was one of the fortunate youngsters who survived the holocaust. There were a million and half children among the six million Jewish people who perished during the darkest period in our history, the World War II years. He was born in Warsaw, Poland to a middle class family. His father was a publisher of a Jewish publication. The war started for him at the age of ten and continued for five years before he was liberated at fifteen. Germany, with Russia. invaded and occupied Warsaw with no declaration of war. Mr. Glauben shared stories of how the population adapted moving in the night instead of day. They existed as they could until they were evacuated to concentration camps. He became an orphan at the age of thirteen.

His is a compelling story, and one that was well worth hearing a second time.
