Jim Montgomery A Life of Swimming

Since 1981, Jim has developed and coached one of the top adult fitness programs in the country. Jim started it off in the 80s with the Lone Star Masters Swim Club which quickly became the second largest Masters program in the country with over 500 swimmers. In 1999 Jim formed a new club, Dallas Aquatic Masters, which became even more recognized as a world leader in adult fitness and competition swimming. Since 2020 Jim has successfully branded his own name to Jim Montgomery Masters Swim as part of the Jim Montgomery Swim School. There he teaches all swimming levels from beginner to competitor, and offers classes proven to help fearful students overcome their fear of water.

With his experience in aquatic facilities and programming, Jim is regarded as an expert in the development, operation and programming of aquatic facilities for school districts, municipalities, universities, hospitals, and commercial uses.

Jim grew up in Madison, WI, and attended Madison East H.S. where he won six state championships in swimming. He went on to swim for James "Doc" Counsilman at Indiana University where he graduated with honors from the IU School of Business. His senior year he was awarded the Belfour award as the top student athlete in the Big Ten Conference. Jim currently lives in Dallas with wife Diane, father to five children: Taylor, Chase, Ann, Ellis and Beau along with seven grandchildren.

Jim is a three time Olympic medal winner in the 1976 Montreal Olympics:

- 100 meters Freestyle: Jim was the first man to swim 100 meters freestyle under 50 seconds (49.99). Breaking this barrier was equivalent to Roger Bannister's four minute mile in track.
- 4 x 100 meters Medley Relay
- 4 x 200 meters Medley Relay

He said Dallas went into COVID with very low inventory. Availability remains very low. There are still many situations where there are multiple

offers. Demand for houses is strong, but buyers do not have a sense of urgency. Their current mortgages are at 3-4%, but the current rate is at

7%. Instead of buying a new home, some owners are choosing to remodel. There is still a steady flow of people coming from out-ofstate. The DFW area led the country in population growth in 2023. The DFW area has now surpassed eight million population. On the seller side, they see the demand and are looking for premium prices. There has been an increase in high-end, luxury sales of over \$5 million. There has been an increase in off-market sales for purposes of privacy and tax advantages. Other sellers wait for the best time to put their houses on the market. There also has been a significant increase in cash buyers. but there has been a decrease in overall transactions. Residential sales are heavily connected to the academic calendar. The peak buythe monorail at Disney Land, where she got to ing months are March thru June and Sept. thru Nov, but the fewest homes are bought in July thru Aug. and Dec. thru Feb. The current market in the Park Cities as compared to historical averages is as follows:

- Months of inventory now: 2-3, historically 5-6;
- Actively listed: now 75+/-, historically 300+/-;

- · Sales price to List price: now 97-98%; historically 94-95%;
- Ave. \$/sq ft: now \$650+/-, historically 300+/-;
- Off Market Transactions: now 35%, historical-

The average sales price compared to the number of homes sold in the Park Cities and North Dallas was fairly steady until COVID hit. The average sales price went from about \$1.5 million to about \$2.5 million, but the number sold has gone down. He forecasted that higher interest rates will be the new norm, that the supply will remain tight, that any slight downward change in interest rates will significantly increase buyer demand, that cash buyers still have an advantage in multiple offer situations, and that off-market transactions will remain steady at 35+/-%. There are also institutional buyers who are competing with individuals.
