I am a Senior Program Manager for Texas Health Resources My Rotary experience has been since 1987 in Tulsa, OK. While in the Sunrise Rotary Club I was International Director and was able to host a Youth exchange student from Latvia. Held many offices in the Sunrise club and was Rotarian of the Year. In the early 90's I was Team Lead for a 6 person GSE team to Thailand, what a wonderful experience.

After moving to Dallas in 1995 I joined The Addison Rotary Club. I have held each local club office at one time or another including President of The Addison Rotary Club. In 2010 I was able to lead another GSE team, this one to India. Few people lead one GSE team and I was able to lead two.

I have been involved with Youth Exchange for over 25 years. Currently I am co-YEO of District 5810 and Recording Secretary of SCRYE (South Central Rotary Youth Exchange); this is the multi-district organization helping 37 districts in 19 states work through Rotary Youth Exchange



Blue Badge to Willie Lees. PP Tracy Gomes




