Jim Montgomery, Olympic Award Winning Swimmer, Jim Montgomery ro speak on "A Life of Swimming." He started by saying that he is always asked if an Olympic

Gold Medal is solid gold, He explained that the last medal that was solid gold was awarded in 1912. The Gold Medal is actually 92.5% silver. Each medal has the sport engraved on the bottom of it. He said he was going to talk about the greatest swim team in Olympic history, the 1976 team which he was on. It started in the Olympic Trials in June, 1976. To make the men's Olympic swimming team

back then was extremely difficult. The finishing time for each heat was faster than the final times for the Olympics; that id how dominating the team was. The teams in 1968 and 1972 had Mark Spitz on them. The men's swimming team had dominated for about sixty years. The women had started to dominate for about twenty years. James "Doc" Counsilman was the Head Coach of the team; he was a very famous coach, and was the coach at the University of Indiana. There were twenty-seven men on the team. It was a strange Olympics because tht IOC had taken out three events. I The rest of the world wanted the American's blood. In seven weeks twenty-seven men came together to create a dominant team. Following the Olympic trials, there were a lot of men from Indiana and from Southern California, so there were diferent cultures. The team coalesced around the Coach. The Coach had written the book. The Science of Swimming, which had been translated into twenty-two languages. The Coach challenged the team to win more gold medals than the rest of the Olympic teams combined. He said that the way for the team to fail was to not come together and support each other. Everybody put their egos aside and worked to win. Team support enhances accomplishment beyond those of individual expectations. The coaches created an environment of creativity, security and empowerment. The team made up its own rules. Everybode was accountavle for each other. They were expected to cheer for each other after their own events were over. In the Olympics one-tenth of a second can make the difference between first place and fourth place. The team swept the first event the first night and swept e=several of the other races as well. Every team member had a voice on the team. The olympics is eight days, and the team had to be ready for eight days, which is longer

than most other competitions. The team was successful because they just wanted to win. They won twelve out of thirteen events.

Jim brought one his Gold Medals so we could see one.


