## Paige Flink, CEO The Family Place

A vocal advocate for ending violence against women, Paige Flink is the Chief Executive Officer of The Family Place, the Dallas area's leading organization delivering proven programs that address emotional and physical abuse and incest. When The Family Place began its work in family violence, there were no laws in Dallas protecting battered women, no policies for the arrest of batterers, and no shelters to save lives. Today, Dallas is recognized for its integrated response to domestic violence victims, and Paige has been instrumental in changing public perception and the community's response. Through Paige's leadership, The Family Place has become a national model in the delivery of family violence services. Paige joined The Family Place in 1991 and became its Executive Director in 1997.

After becoming Executive Director, she led the agency through the planning and fundraising process of raising over \$6 million in a capital campaign to build a new shelter. Opened in May 2000, The Family Place Safe Campus is a state of the art facility which has 100 emergency shelter beds, 25 transitional housing apartments and a licensed day-care facility. She also led the community through a planning process which resulted in the establish-

ment of Faith and Liberty's Place, a supervised visitation and exchange center which serves Dallas County families. In 2009, she spearheaded the initiative of bringing over \$9 million in federal stimulus money from the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs for processing rental assistance for vulnerable families in the Dallas County. In addition to this, Paige has taken the lead in starting Dallas County's High Risk Offender program. Paige has received local and national recognition for her work on behalf of victims, including the Peace Award from the Sunshine Lady Foundation, the Women's Advocacy Award from Legal Aid of NorthWest Texas, and the Women's Center of Dallas Maura Award. Mosaic Family Services named her 2012 Champion of Human Rights. In 2016 Paige was selected as CNM Connect's Non-Profit CEO of the Year.

In 2015 Paige announced The Family Place's second capital campaign to open Ann Moody Place. This \$16.5 million facility opened in May of 2017 and is home to a second emergency shelter, pet shelter, Central Dallas Counseling Center, and a multitude of other Family Place programs. In 2017 Paige also led The Family Place to open the first men's shelter in the state of Texas.

Valerie Pelan introduced our speaker today, Nicola Longford, CEO of the Sixth Floor Museum at Dealey Plaza. She began by saying that



there are two historic sites in Dallas; one is Fair Park and the other is the Dealey Plaza area, including the Old Red Courthouse. Preservation of history is at the core of culture.

The Sixth Floor Museum opened in 1989, twenty-six years after the assassination. The immediate response after the event was to want to demolish the building, but the Dallas Historical Society prevailed to save it. Today, the Dallas County Commissioners' offices take up the first five floors. The Museum is on the sixth floor where evidence of the assassin was found. Initially, the funding was a hard sell because it was not seen as a viable project, but currently, they have half a million visitors from all over the world every year. The museum is recognized as a model for presenting contentious history in a fair and equitable manner. It is an impartial, multigenerational destination and forum for exploring the memory and effects of the events surrounding the assassination of President Kennedy through sharing his legacy and impact. The museum holds a large collection of first person accounts, including over 1,700 interviews. They document stories for the historical record and personal perspectives for future generations. Most of the artifacts are from Dallas; they are made more vibrant by the personal histories. The museum is more than just a tourist destination; people come to see history recorded in an unbiased way. They try to engage, connect and inspire in terms of presidential history.
