A member of the club told me how his daughter and her husband, who live and work off their sailboat, had been attacked by four men with guns and machetes as they were anchored at Panama's Pearl Islands awaiting passage through the Panama Canal.

The thieves took all cash, wallets, jewelry, phones, foul weather gear, lifejackets, clothing, and jugs of gasoline, as well as ripping out the boat's electronic gear. After they were gone, Chris was able to contact police and determine the boat was safe to sail to Naos Marina near Panama City to await repairs.

beautiful cards and love after the death of her son. She then announced the packing day at the North Texas Food Bank, and said that Interact members would be joining us.

PP Jeff introduced our speaker today, Nick Vaidya. He began by saying that he usually talks about strategies for companies, but today he want ed to talk about something different. His life experiences in the last several years has been difficult. He wants to share what he has learned. He came to the USA in 1989 with \$500, but back then you couldn't work. He did six years of graduate work in the US, and started teaching, but moved on and started a company. Life was good. Then he was hit very hard by a divorce, and became an alcoholic. Then his house caught on fire and burned to the ground. He said today life is good; he is off of alcohol and has a close relationship with his two daughters. He asked how did he not know what was coming, when people around him seemed to know. These are blindspots. Intelligence is not the driving force of success, prosperity and happiness; it is something else. He started to read the scriptures of various religions and neuropsychology. He thought he should try to help others not to make the same mistakes. The question is why do we do that? From a business strategy he knows that people pay attention to strategy and to knowledge. Thousands of books and articles are published every year. Information is not the driver of outcomes. There is something else that moderates the relationship between knowledge and outcomes. He calls that moderater variable the Drunk Elephant. There are two minds, the Drunk Elephant and the Mouse mind. The Drunk Elephant mind has been with us from the beginning of our existence, but the Mouse mind has been with us for a much shorter time. It is the one that talks, that conceptualizes, that thinks. The Drunk Elephant mind is the one that has supported us for all this time. It does what it wants. It has its own liberties, likes and dislikes. When the Drunk Elephant is aligned with something you want to do, you will get it. It is not only what the Mouse mind thinks.

Through a call to RI, I reached the Rotary Support Center, who put me in contact with the RC of Panama Este and a Club and District Support supervisor. He listened with empathy and promised to try to connect with local people who could help. He then reached out to a CDS senior supervisor for the Americas, who contacted zone and district leaders.

The president of the Panama Este Club, contacted a member of the RC of Balboa less than two miles from the marina. He immediately visited the boat, and helped them get basic supplies to replace the stolen items. He contacted friends in the marine supply business and set up a work group to examine the boat and begin repairs.
