



On 21 March, the Federal Government of Somalia, World Health Organization and the Global Polio Eradication Initiative recommitted to stopping the ongoing outbreak of circulating poliovirus type 2 in Somalia.

The Somalia Polio Eradication Action Plan 2022 outlines a four-point call to action to stop the spread of the current outbreak. The plan aims to direct efforts and resources towards boosting population immunity, making concerted efforts to reach high-risk populations, enhancing the search for poliovirus circulation, strengthening coordination of stakeholders.


