Mike Piellucci is *D Magazine's* sports editor. A Dallas native, he is a graduate of Jesuit College Preparatory School of Dallas and the University of Southern California. From 2015 through 2017, he was a staff writer at *VICE Sports*, where he journeyed to the heart of East Texas to find the youngest college football coach in America, snuck into Tim Tebow's private baseball workout, and wrote a whole lot about college football.

From 2019 through 2021, he was a staff editor at *The Athletic*, where he helped supervise the company's Dallas bureau and, later, work nationally on its NBA team. While there, he talked photography with Bob Lilly, loss with Babe Laufenberg, and calf ligaments with J.J. Barea. In between, his writing was featured in *The*

New YorkTimes, Sports Illustrated, Los Angeles Magazine, The Ringer, and *Deadspin* on subjects ranging from football and base-ball to professional wrestling and intercollegiate meat judging.

In July 2021, he joined D as its first sports editor. Two months later, StrongSide, D's online sports section, launched with a profile of Dale Hansen on the occasion of his final sports broadcast. Since then, StrongSide has emerged as one of the sharpest outlets in town covering pro, college, and high school sports, along with plenty of other stories off the beaten path. Last year, Mike's profile of Dallas Wings guards Arike Ogunbowale and Marina Mabrey was included in the 2022 edition of The Year's Best Sports Writing.

The Dallas Historical Society expressed interest and went to Pennsylvania to discuss it. They have acquired it. It had to be divided into four parts and disassmbled to move it to Dallas but it is now set up again. It is worth seeing.

Ashlee Brill Weidner began by saying that the museum was built in nine months for a cost of \$1.7 million, the most expensive at the time. They have Santa Ana's spurs, Dav Crockett's pistol, documents and the diarama. They are working on a new program, Happy Hour Around Town. The first one will be at the Stoneleigh Hotel, which is now one hundred years old. She then turned the program over to David Lee,

He said how happy he was to be speaking, especially on San Jacinto Day. He described in the predawn hours the tired Texians watched from the crumbling walls of the Alamo Santa Ana's army. Why did they defend the Alamo? Why did they make the sacrifice, and why did it spark the imagination? San Antonio de Bexar was the largest at the time. It was the capitol of the Tejanos, and a center of power, and communication. It was inevitable that the conflict reach San Antonio. It was also a gateway to the Anglo colonists in the East. In October the Mexican Army had been forced to retreat southward by a Texian force led by Stephen F. Austin, leaving no one behind. Then Santa Ana's army marched northward to reclaim Bexar from the "land pirates." His army had little water or food. Many had no shoes. They were from climates farther south and were miserable in winter. They were said to have been "raised by the bayonet and held together by the bayonet." Many of the Texians had gone home. They were left with about one hundred men who fortified the Alamo. Sam Houston wrote to blow up the Alamo and leave. Soon Jim Bowie and his men arrived and Davy Crockett arrived with his men. The Alamo was not a fortress; some of the walls were only six feet high. The Mexicans raised the red flag of no quarter and the Texians replied with a cannon shot. The Mexicans attacked to regain the honor of Mexico, shouting "Viva Santa Ana."




