Susan Glen announced the spring volunteer day at the North Texas Food Bank. She said that since it was Cinco de Mayo weekend, they would have lunch at Rosa's Cafe after their shift had ended.

Patti Schaub and our speaker conducted the Raffle drawing. **Herb Ziev** had the winning ticket, but he did not win the money. The Raffle is up to \$1,925. Buy a ticket next week' the money is getting laarger and the cards are getting fewer!

PP Richard Stanford introduced our speaker today, Patrick Jenevein to speak on "Chasing the Red Dragon." He said that Cleve Clinton and his law firm had helped him win a suit against the Communist Party He said thaat China is the Communist Party. He had been working in the People's Republic of China since 1956 in the energy business, bringing electricity to the people of rural China. He also began working with the Aviation Industry Corporation of China (AVIC) since 1997. He became partner in HT Blade, a mainland China based manufacturer of wind turbine blades. He said that in general the previous president was more friendly to international business than is the current president. They developed the biggest wind turbine blade company in the world. He wanted to put a part of the company in the U.S. but China pulled back the funding so it had to be built in China. The Communists were concerned that a company in the U.S. could take money out of the company. Today he is designing strategies to restrict the Communist Party. There are 350,000 Chinese students in science and engineering classes. STEM students make our country stronger. He believes all citizens must take a Civics class to know the difference between the Communist and U.S. systems. He was asked about the tariffs; he said he saw them as a reason to be hopeful. He said he is hopeful because President Xi has a rough economy and needs cash. He also said that Taiwan has never been part of China. And the Imperial Dragon has five toes.






