Max Glauben, Holocaust Survivor Be an "Upstander" not a "Bystander"

Do not create the same hatred that was done to us. "I am a strong believer that we must tell the stories to the youngsters - they are going to be our witnesses...But please present it in a way, with the kind of emotions, that will not create the same hatred that was done to us" (quote from Max Glauben posted at the United Nations). Max was born in Warsaw, Poland. In the years after the Nazis invaded, Max's family lived in the Warsaw Ghetto, a square-mile neighborhood confining a half million Jewish people. His family survived that time, but they were found hiding with a group of 80 to 90 in a basement. Max's family was stuffed in

a boxcar with many others for a 5 day train ride with no food or water. The boxcar carrying Glauben's family stopped at Majdanek, the first of his five concentration camps. As they left the train, the Germans separated women and children from men. Max's father grabbed his hand, and they were separated from his mother and brother, who he would never see again. At a second camp, Max was separated from his father who never returned. On April 16, 1945, the Germans ordered a group, including Max, on a death march from Flossenburg to Dachau, and on April 23, 1945, he was liberated by the US Army.

MusiCamp is a short-term youth exchange program for talented young people, aged sixteen through twenty-four, organized by District 5340 in San Diego, CA. The program allows students to experience new cultures and make new friends while planting the seeds of greater international understanding. The program, which lasts three weeks, is now in its fourteenth year.

Each participant must show a high level of skill in music. The students have two weeks of intense practice with the San Diego Youth Symphony and Conservatory and perform at symphony and chamber music events. The

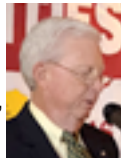

President **Paul** asked PP **Fred Brown** and PP **Karen Farris** to come to the podium to announce some RCPC Award winners, who had not been able to attend the Awards Dinner. The first was a second winner of the **Linda Tunnel** New Member Award for her enthusiastic involvement, **Katt Massey**. The **Cleve Clinton** Collaborative Award went to long time member **Orville Salmon** with the Salvation Army. Congratulations to both!

Once and future member **Daniel Jacob** introduced our speaker today, Chuck Cooperstein, the play-by-play announcer for the Dallas Mavericks, to talk about the team. He began by saying that it didn't take much to get him excited about the Mavericks, but that this year, the team is going to be a challenge for any team to play against this year. They finally signed DeAndre Jordan, who is ready to play and is going to be fantastic. The Mavericks, when they want a player, are going to get them, no matter what the cost. been struggling since their championship year. They have great scouts, some of whom are experts on European basketball. The Mavericks survived the draft this year and signed Luka Doncic, who was born in Slovenia. He was playing in the Spanish League, which is the best league except for the NBA. He is so talented that he can play four different positions. He is predicted to be the Rookie of the Year. He could be the face of the Mavericks for years to come. Dennis Smith improved last year, and he has the potential to be excellent. In an era of free agency it is unusual to see a player staying with a team. Dirk Nowitzki is the essence of loyalty and will play with the Mavericks for at least one more year. Mark Cuban has said that it is up to Dirk to say when he no longer wants to play. The season starts October 17. The problem the Mavericks have had is starting playing. They need to find their rotations earlier. They can't afford to start slow. The team will have to win at least twenty games in the Eastern Conference and hold their own in the Western Conference. Every game in the West will be a killer. It is an extraordinary time for the team as it transitions from older players to a real young team. He was asked about the allegations of the climate of sexual harassment. He said that the report would be out soon. Since Cynthia Marshall has been hired to be the CEO, the whole office has changed. He was also asked if he thought that Dirk Nowitzki would stay in Dallas. He said that he thought Dirk would always keep a house in Dallas, but that he wanted his children to see the rest of the world, to know his family in Germany and his wife's family in Sweden, as well as other family members who live in Kenya. He was asked what influence Mark Cuban has in deciding coaching and strategy. He replied that it was less than none, that Cuban hires good coaches and relies on them.
