Tom Luce Bio Labs

Tom Luce's life has been one of family, professional accomplishments, public service, and social entrepreneurship.

He received his undergraduate and law degrees from Southern Methodist University where he has been honored as a Distinguished Alumni. Tom went on to become the founding and managing partner of the Hughes and Luce law firm. He was lead attorney on multibillion mergers and litigation and was selected at various points in his career as one of the best attorneys at local, state, and national levels.

His public service in Texas was distinguished by gubernatorial and legislative appointments to major state positions including Chief Justice of the Supreme Court pro tempore, Sunset Commission, Cancer Prevention and Research Institute, Texas

Commission on Judiciary, Chief of Staff of the Select Committee on Public Education and the Superconducting Super Collider.

On the national level, he was appointed as Assistant Secretary of Education by President George W. Bush, confirmed by the United States Senate, and appointed to The Library of Congress Board by the Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Tom went on to found Texas 2036, an organization dedicated to addressing the impact of the state's growth by an estimated 10 million people when it turns 200 years old. In addition to Texas 2036, Tom has founded and lead numerous other non-profit organizations dedicated to serving the needs of others These include the Texas Business and Education Coalition, Just

for the Kids, Data Quality Campaign, theability, the National Math and Science Initiative, and the Meadows Mental Health Policy Institute.

His latest venture is serving as CEO of Biotech Initiatives of Lyda Hill Philanthropies, focused on developing the entire life science ecosystem across the state of Texas.

He has authored two books on improving public education and has taught at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard, the University of Texas LBJ School of Public Affairs, Southern Methodist University, and the University of Texas at Dallas.

Tom has been married to his wife, Pam, for more than 60 years. They have three children and seven grandsons.

PP **Happy Franklin** called the meeting to order. **John Brown** gave the invocation and then led the Pledge of Allegiance and the *Star Spangled Banner*. President **Happy** introduced our visitors and guests and called for "happy bucks."

Eric Harrison introduced our Market-place Advertiser of the Week, **Richard Stanford** and CC Young Senior Living Center.

PP **Happy** presented **Michelle Brown** her permanent member badge.



PDG **Richard Gilman** gave his new memberspeech. He said he was born in Dallas and attended Stephen C. Foster Elementary School and Hillcrest H. S. - at the same time PP **Linda Tunnell** was there. He attended the University of North Texas and became a teacher. He spent fifty-four years as a classroom teacher and now supervises student teachers for UNT. He has been married for forty-six years and has three grown children, all with jobs. One of his principals was a Rotarian and encouraged him to join. He was active in a few clubs in the Richardson area. He joined an e-club, but wanted to change, so he started watching several Rotary clubs and chose RCPC because he thought it was what a Rotary Club should be.

John Brown introduced our speaker today, **David Preziosi**, the Executive Director of the Texas Historical Commission. He started by saying the the Texas Historical Foundation has been a since 1954 and works to preserve the history of Texas. They give grants of eighty to one hundred thousand dollars each year. They fund projects all across the state. Many are in small towns which have less access to money. They preserve buildings, archeological sites, documents, artifacts, and records. They also provide money for producing films, publications, and exhibits that talk about the history of Texas. He was with Preservation Dallas, which

has celebrated fifty years. It is a private, non-profit organization which collaborates, advocates and educates for the preservation and revitalization of historic buildings and neighborhoods across Dallas. The Park Cities does not have the same legal protection as Dallas so it is more challenging. Dallas has diverse architecture from the commercial buildings downtown to historical schools and parks, as well as amazing neighborhoods. There are also archeological sites of very early settlements. Historic preservation provides a visual link to the past and tells about the community stories. The Sixth Floor Museum is the best place to tell the story of the assassination of President Kennedy because you can look out over Dealey Plaza. Preservation Dallas helped to preserve the building, and now it is one of the most visited places in Dallas. Historic preservation also helps the economy by promoting tourism and increasing development. An example is in the Bishop Arts area. It has taken twenty years, but it is now an interesting place to go, and it has increased development in the surrounding area, also. We also have places like Fair Park which is the most incredible fair grounds in the country, with all of the Art Deco buildings. It actually is on the National Register of Historic Places. Two other places also with this designation are Dealey Plaza and Highland Park Shopping Center. One of the early efforts was to save Swiss Avenue. Back in the 1960s and 70s the big houses were starting to be cut up into apartments and the city was trying to rezone it. Some of the property owners started to fight to save the neighborhood, and that is how Preservation Dallas started. It was the first historic residential district in Dallas. He went on to talk about other historic places in Dallas, such as the old Dallas H.S. (Crozier Tech), The knights of Pythias (The Pittman Building), the Statler Hilton Hotel, Tenth Street Historic District, Deep Ellum, Brinks Coffee Shop, and other places.
