

He received his undergraduate and law degrees from Southern Methodist Uni- as Assistant Secretary of Education by versity where he has been honored as a Distinguished Alumni. Tom went on to become the founding and managing partner of the Hughes and Luce law firm. He was lead attorney on multibillion mergers and litigation and was selected at various points in his career as one of the best attorneys at local, state, and national levels.

His public service in Texas was distinguished by gubernatorial and legislative appointments to major state positions including Chief Justice of the Supreme Court pro tempore, Sunset Commission, Cancer Prevention and Research Institute, Texas

Tom Luce's life has been one of family. Commission on Judiciary, Chief of Staff of the Select Committee on Public Education and the Superconducting Super Collider.

On the national level, he was appointed President George W. Bush, confirmed by the United States Senate, and appointed to The Library of Congress Board by the Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives.

Tom went on to found Texas 2036, an organization dedicated to addressing the impact of the state's growth by an estimated 10 million people when it turns 200 years old. His latest venture is serving as CEO of Biotech Initiatives of Lyda Hill Philanthropies, focused on developing the entire life science ecosystem across the state of Texas.

He has authored two books on improving public education and has taught at the Kennedy School of Government at Harvard, the University of Texas LBJ School of Public Affairs, Southern Methodist University, and the University of Texas at Dallas.

Tom has been married to his wife, Pam, for more than 60 years. They have three children and seven grandsons.

has celebrated fifty years. It is a provate, nonprofit organization which collaborates, advocates and efucates for the preservation and revitalization of historic buildings and neighborhoods across Dallas. The Park Cities does not have the same legal protection as Dallas so it is more challenging. Dallas has diverse architecture from the commercial buildings downtown to historical schools and parks, as well as amazing neighborhoods. There are also archeological sites of very early settlements. Historic preservation provides a visual link to the past and tells about the community stories. The Sixth Floor Museum is the best place to tell the story of the assassination of President Kennedy because you can look out over Dealey Plaza. Preservation Dallas helped to preserve the building, and now it is one of the most visited places in Dallas. Historic preservation also helps the economy by promoting ample is in the Bishop Arts area. It has taken twenty years, but it is now an interesting place to go, and it has increased development in the surrounding area, also. We also have places like Fair Park which is the most incredible fair grounds in the country, with all of the Art Deco buildings. It actually is on the National Register of Historic Places. Two other places also with this designation are Dealey Plaza and Highland Park Shopping Center. One of the early efforts was to save Swiss Avenue. Back in the 1960s and 70s the big houses were starting to be cut up into apartments and the city was trying to rezone it. Some of the property owners started to fight to save the neighborhood, and that is hoe Preservation Dallas started. It was the first historic residential district in Dallas. He went on to talk about other historic places in Dallas, such as the old Dallas H.S. (Crozuer Tech), The knights of Pythias (The Pittman Building), the Statler Hilton Hotel, Tenth Street Historic District, Deep El-


