Robert Kent, Texas Dir. -Trust for Public Land Building a Greener Texas, One Park at a Time

Robert Kent is the Texas State Director for The Trust for Public Land, where he leads a team of colleagues and volunteers working to make the health, climate, equity, and community benefits of parks and nature accessible to all.

Since joining the organization in 2014, he has led the organization's work to develop a network of parks and trails across southern Dallas, help pass a \$310 million bond package for parks and trails in Dallas, develop an open space plan for City of Fort Worth, open public schoolyards in Dallas for use as neighborhood parks, acquire hundreds of acres of land for new parks throughout Texas, and connect community members, stakeholders, and donors to realize a shared vision

for parks and public spaces that benefit all.

Prior to working for The Trust for Public Land, Robert served as the Policy Director for the North Texas Commission. Robert received his BA from Baylor University, where he studied economics and environmental science, and his MSc. from the University of Glasgow, where he studied international economic development. In 2009, Robert completed a 2,100-mile southbound thru-hike of the Appalachian Trail, followed by a coast-to-coast hike across Scotland in 2011. Born and raised in Dallas, Robert is passionate about using close-to-home nature to build green, resilient cities. Robert and his family live in Dallas near their favorite park, White Rock Lake..

Colors of the 2023-24 Theme Logo

RI President Gordon McInally is calling for Rotary members to "Create Hope in the World by working for peace and mental wellbeing.

The 2023-24 presidential theme is accompanied by a logo that consists of three dynamic shapes with color gradients of dark blue to purple, dark red to light red, and from intense orange to bright yellow.

Gordon explains that the palate is inspired by the colors of Scotland - the purple of heather, the blue of the ocean, and the orange/yellow of the setting sun over the cliffs. The colors identify with modern Scotland and are an intentional move beyond the stereotype of tartan (plaid) often associated with Scotland.

The kids come to the camp on Monday and they learn all the steps to make a movie. They write the script and direct the movie. In one week they have made a short film. A professional comes in to cut the movie due to the short time factor. Then the movie is judged by people from the Dallas International Film Festival. Then they debut the movies at the Studio Movie Grill on the next Monday. Then the kids said they wanted more. Then they started doing weekend workshops on cinematography, lighting, and those went over really well. So they expanded again. They tried building a non-profit movie studio for kids, cessful. We hope to keep building every year. and found out they could build a community center with a film studio. They do movie productions in the morning and after school programs in the afternoon. 
