quency engineer. She is also pursuing her MBA. She first joined RCPC in 2017; her main reason for joining is peace. She had to drop out when she was looking for a job. She has decided to rejoin. She thanked all of the members who have helped her.

Jeff Brady introduced our speaker today, Tom Luce who spoke on "Bio Labs." He began by saying that Bio Life Science Companies have been in Dallas for

twenty years. One of his reasons he is supproting the life sciences. He believes that it will continue to diversify the economy. bolster the workforce and create life-saving treatments. North Texas has the potential to become the next life sciences center. North Texas has had greater economic growth than much of the rest of the country. There is a lot of funding in the area. It is the top area for job creation in the country. There is a high concentration of tech jobs. There are six major not-for-profit health systems in the area and two major for profit companies, including two public health systems and one veterans health system. There are seven national healthcare corporations and 104 life science startups. Texas is attracting capital from out of state. In the last five years the growth of the bio-tech industry in North Texas is two and a half times that of the rest of the country. Our strength is in research. Sixty-seven percent of the regions total R&D spending is dedicated to the life sciences. UT-Southwestern currently is the number one source of high quality medical research. Pegasus Park is located near UT-Southwestern. It will create in one space all of the partners needed to grow the entire sector, including startups, incubators, venture firms,

and lab space. The complex is dedicated for

innovative companies to grow.


