Walt Marcum introduced our speaker today Robert Kent, the Texas Director of the Trust for Public Land. He began by saying that everyone should have a safe, close-to-home, quality place to be out in nature. He asked where we could walk in ten minutes. The Trust for Public land has a mission to connect everyone to the outdoors. They have helped to create over five thousand parks across the country. They have generated over \$84 Billion for parks and access to land and water. They help protect over 3.7 Million acres of public land for parks, forests etc. There are about nine million people who live within a ten minute walk of a park the Trust for Public Land has created. Since 1979 the Trust for Public Land has protected over 43,000 acres of Texas's most important public lands, including 4,000 acres in North Texas. Despite the progress that has been made, there are still challenges. Neighborhoods with more parks are six degrees cooler than others, People with increased access to green space have lower rates of stroke, hypertension, asthma and heart disease. Parks and trees filter runoff of storms. People with safe greenspace, get more exercise. Over the last few years, Dallas has had a renaissance in parks. Parks bring a 1:7 economic return. Investing in parks and trails is one of the best things a city can do to generate an economic return. Currently 73% of Dallas residents live within a ten-minute walk of a park. About \$124 per resident is spent on parks. For that amount every year a family gets access to

all 400 parks in Dallas. Also they have worked

Our Rotary club has been working towards Truth and Reconciliation with the local Tsawwassen First Nation (TFN) for the past several years. I learned that the teachers of the Delta School District's Indigenous Teaching Program wanted to purchase a fiberglass canoe for Indigenous and non-Indigenous students to take on field trips together. The theme would be "Paddling Together." With unanimous approval the club applied for a district grant and bought the canoe. Wave Warrior has a Rotary emblem on the stern.

The canoe will help non-Indigenous students learn more about canoe culture and connect them with Indigenous ways of knowing and being.
