glad to be back, before starting his New Member Speech. He said he grew up in eastern Pennsylvania. He received a degree in Marketing from Temple University. His first job was in New York City with a department store. He then moved to Dallas. He said he has had multiple careers and is semi-retired, but works for his son in a small law firm. He has been married for twenty years and has three stepsons and three grandchildren.

PP **Paul Pirok** introduced this year's Legacy of Leadership program. He said that this is the only club who has this sort of program. It is designed to prepare servant leaders and to create new leaders and connections within the club. We are now starting the fifth Cohort. **Paul** will be sending an email to enroll.

PP **Ley** introduced PP **Richard Stanford** who was filling in for our scheduled speaker, Congressman Colin

Allred who was at a vote in Washington. PP **Richard** continued his Fun History of Dallas. He began by saying that a lot of outlaws had come through Dallas, Belle Starr, Cole Younger, Frank and Jesse James and Sam Bass. Doc Holliday was a dentist here in the 1870s, but cards and booze took over his life. He went west because of a lung problem and ended up at the OK Corral. After WWI Dallas had a huge resurgence in Klan activity; one in three men were members of the Klan. One year there was a Klan Day at the State Fair. Klan membership dropped precipitously by the mid-1920s. He then moved on to the 1950s and 60s, which were less criminal, but somewhat unsavory, burlesque and strip-pers. There were some big name strippers in Dallas and well-known clubs. Some were somewhat reputable. Bob Hope and Tommy Dorsey had played at some of the clubs. Earlier, at the Centennial Fair Sally Rand had done her fan dance. The Burlesque strippers had to have a "theme." One of the most famous was Candy Barr. She was estarnged from her hus-band. He came over to beat her again and she shot him, but they both showed up in court. He went on to talk about segregation and integration in the 1960s and 70s, and how Dallas dealt with it.

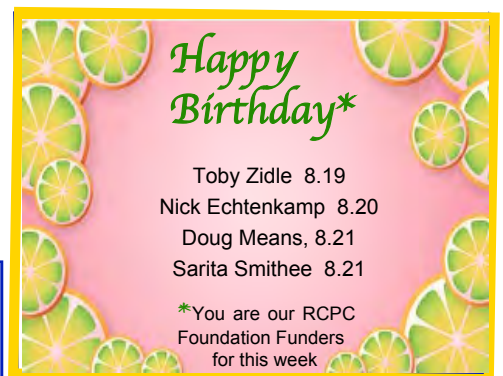
