PP **Richard** called for the raffle drawing. He held the winning ticket !!?? He didnot win the raffle, which is now up to about \$80.

Jeff Brady introduced our speaker today Ross Guieb, Executive Director of the Bush Combat Deveopment Complex. He began by saying that the complex is focused on deliveringvery unique capabilities to the military. He wants to be sure that our sons and daughters fight an unfair fight. This is not about building new weapon systems and capabilities, it is about detrrence. The campus is 2300 acres that was an old army airfield. About \$1.6 Billion was put into modernizing that campus to power today's technology. The Secretary of the Army knew we needed to accelerate modernization. They went to five locations before coming to Texas. The Four Star Headquarters is in Austin. They moved a \$187 Billion portfolio from Washington, DC, to Austin. In 2018 he moved to Texas. Texas A&M was already doing work in hypersonices, directed energy, and integrated autonomy, which is how you navigate airground and ground-air in degraded environments. We are so network centric, what happens if thet network is knocked out.so that machines that are programmed to do certain things will continue to function. in a degraded or challenged environment, it is really difficult. Texas A&M offered to build the Ballistics Air Optics and Materials Test Range. It is the largest hypersonic test range in the U.S. It will be one kilometer long. You can show the effect of a droplet or piece of sand on a hypersonic projectile. They can fly drones up to 1,000 feet, and they have a ten-mile corridor in which to fly drones. We have great research folks. They have the Innovation Proving Ground. Lone Star Institute in Corpus Christi has a massive drone testing program. They have the largest 5G outdoor test network. They have a potential investment in chip manufacturing. TX A&M just created a space institute and an innovation proving ground. Listen to more of this program on Youtube.



D CEO's 2024 Nonprofit & Corporate Citizenship Awards excerpted from DCEO

The winner of the Leadership Excellence (Midsize) Award: Stephanie Bohan, Hope Cottage Since becoming CEO of Hope Cotpany's influential and robust nonprofit organ- tage, Stephanie Bohan has revitalized the orcase, youth education, and parenting supportive services. At the helm since 2022, she has successfully taken their \$400,000 budget deficit and transformed it into a \$600,000 surplus. Under her leadership, Hope Cottage's parenting department has grown from 28 clients to more than 200. Beyond that, Bohan oversaw the opening of CeCe's Place in less than a year to provide maternal healthcare, taking on more than 50 clients in under 20 days.
