Our visitors and guests today included a DG Bill Slicker and DGE Beverly Grogan. Herb Ziev introduced our Marketplace Advertisers of the Week, Nolan Duck and DBG Advisors who specialize in selling privately held companies. PP Greg Pape remarked that in 2017-18, 100% of the members of RCPC were Paul Harris Fellows. There were forty members who were not PHFs up to that time. but fifteen members contributed to make them PHFs. He remarked that in some clubs another member must make you a PHF before you can contribute additional funds yourself. PP Greq then called Richard Stanford and Larry Nichols to the podium and awarded them a



PHF pin with three sapphires, designating a 4th level contribution. President **Paul** announced a Program Committee Meeting for Aug-ust 30. today District Gov-ernor of
District 5810, Bill Slick-er. DG
Bill started by remarking that "It
is a good day to be a Ro-tarian."
He also said that he would be
focusing on having more fun this



year and was planning to have more parties. He continued that Rotary was making a difference around the world. He commented that Rotary conventions light up with excitement. with representatives from countries all over the world. Rotary can be a little liberal, but it is made up of people from all walks of life and cultures. He said that there have been some changes starting on July 1; if you have a community project, you must have a community impact statement. The people in the community must be asked what they want before a project is started. The locals are asked to put money in a community fund, managed by the local elders, to contribute to the project. Rotary does not just give money, but facilitates the project. Many projects have brought clean water to communities, which has the added benefit that women and children no longer have to spend so much time getting water and can start a home business or go to school. There are kids in Ghana who are raising money to build a VoTech school. This will better train the people there, and they will not have to leave their families. Fresh water also impacts the spread of polio. Rotary has signed an agreement with Ghana to put in microflush toilets in homes, schools and other public places. The families must buy them, but they are giving the blueprints to the locals so that they can manufacture them. RI has eliminated polio in all but three countries, Nigeria, Afghanistan, Pakistan. The women are the best navigators in providing the vaccine. However, at least twenty women have been killed by terrorists while distributing polio vaccines.
