PP Jeff Sheehan introduced our speaker today, Steve Ladik. He started by saying that he was not going to talk about illegal immigration, but with the immigration issues that confront professional athletes. He said



after law school he went to work with one of the few immigration lawyers back then. He worked there until he joined a larger law firm. One day one of the heads of the law firm asked him to get the visas for two foreign players coming to play for the Mavericks. The visa for athletes had to show they were preeminent in their field. Once the season was over, they went home to Ger-many, but did not renew their visas properly, So when they were trying to get a green card, they had been playing for their second season illegally. In 1987 the Mavs had four international players. He went with one player for his green card interview, and they were followed by a whole news crew. Individual athletes just have an agent, so they don't know all of the immigra-tion requirements. In team sports the team usually has a person who takes care of all of the visas for the members of the team. His name started being known by the individual athletes. In the 1990s the PGA Tour called him asked if they could use him as their official lawyer to refer all of their new players. Currently, he represents about ninety percent of the foreign golfers. He used to represent the NHL. Then the NFL recruited him. He also worked for the Rangers if they had a problem case. He also worked for the Cowboys. He represented a professional poker player, and convinced im-


