

There are two approaches to the business of space. One is looking at money that is invested in space. The other is the growth in revenue from that industry; the size of the mar-Lab Media. There is money to be invested, but there are fewer companies. By 2040 the revenue generated by the global space industry may grow to more than \$1 Trillion. Some of the industries in space are finance, space adventure travel, space media. robotics, astro-robotics, space companies, spaceports, space training, government, space military, space radio and podcasts, space simulation, space camp, biospheres, space consulting and space accelerators. One of the most famous space startups is Back to Space, located in Richardson. According to NASA, they are going to be on Mars by 2030. One of the strategies of going to Mars is to make the Moon the landing station. Elon Musk said that

he would be on Mars sooner, but he wants to

go direct to Mars. He has started delivering


